It's time once again to lace-up your sneaks and limber up your muscles for the 20th Annual AIDS Walk Austin, benefitting AIDS Services of Austin and over ten other outstanding HIV/AIDS organizations providing support and direct care services for people living with HIV/AIDS in Central Texas. There are over 4,000 people living with HIV/AIDS in Austin, and approximately 1500 Austinites living with HIV/AIDS that don't know they have it. In Austin alone, 100 people die of HIV/AIDS each year - which is why the Walk and the organizations that it benefits are so vital and necessary to the well-being of the entire community. And you can help, by devoting a few hours of your Sunday morning to helping make the future brighter for those challenged by the pandemic. In addition to the Walk itself, AIDS Walk Austin will display sections of the AIDS Memorial Quilt to commemorate the event's 20th Anniversary. And so it was, *This Week in Texas* 1991....and, 1980.

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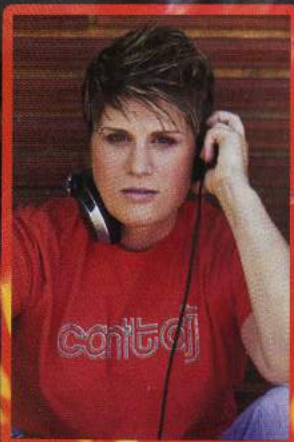

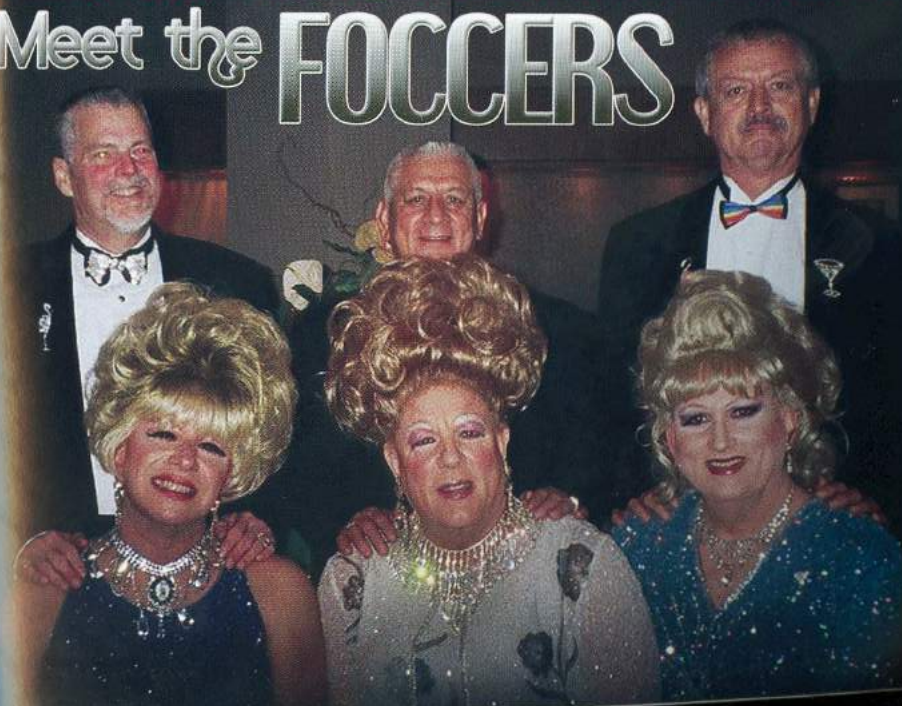
friends, in fact - with Lola Bouvier and the members of The Texas Riviera Empire in Corpus Christi, and were amazed at the wonderful way she and the Court reached out to the entire community in a diverse way that helped do so much for so many...from the Rainbow Room Children's Home, to AIDS charities, church's, hospitals, clinics and beyond. They also noticed that these Corpus fun-raisers have a blast doing it and are, needless to say, very successful. With that in mind The FOCCERS were born..."Friends of Corpus Christi Empire Reign Supporters"... FOCCERS ... The FOCCERS channel their funds.... every single dollar of them...through The Bullfrog Benevolence Fund that is administered by River City Living Church. The Fund is in place to assist those affected and infected with HIV and AIDS. This includes medication, food items, toiletries, utility bills, rents, medical equipment, transportation costs, and other essential items for healthful living. It serves as a strong resource for SAAF, AARC, Beat AIDS, HAC, FFACTS, WE ARE ALIVE, the Veterans Hospital Clinic, as well as other community resources. They also assist those in the community with funeral and cremation expenses who have lost a loved one or a friend. And, most importantly, they have fun doing it.

The group had become very close - became fast

Officially starting in July 2006, the FOCCERS held a few small shows and private functions, raising almost \$5800.00 between start-up and December of that same year. With a steady growth in membership every month, they decided to try something new, and on March 10, 2007 they hosted "One Night Only" at the Blue Bubble Ballroom - an extravaganza of talent that quickly became a diverse "love-in," with an elite audience of 300 from all walks of life and backgrounds, The FOCCERS made history that night by raising almost \$9000.00!!

Says Brown, "From that cold day in Buffalo to now, it has been an incredible experience...The FOCCERS are a force to be reckoned with." Apparently so. They proudly served as "Host Sponsors" of the SAAF Webb Party this year and have just completed an amazing fund raising drive for the SAAF AIDS Walk 2007 by raising \$7687.00...bringing their total raised in just a year and a half to almost \$30,000.00!!! They now have 110 members and continue to grow every day. A force to be reckoned with, indeed!

And that force would love to have you join them...their financials and their hearts are open to you. Their lifetime dues are only \$25, and they only have two rules...you are asked to attend two events per year and to cause NO DRAMA as a member. They definitely have put the "fun" back in fund-raising, but they do take it all very seriously...especially in these times when San Antonio is experiencing government cuts in funding. They have a clear vision as to their cause and they are focused on their purpose, and the best news is they have only just begun!

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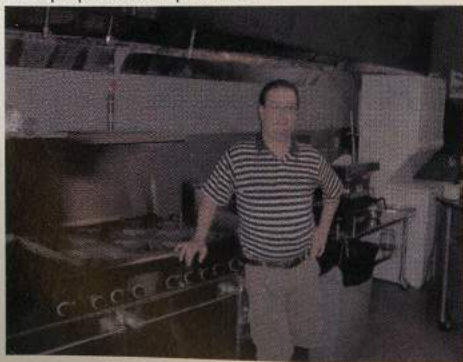

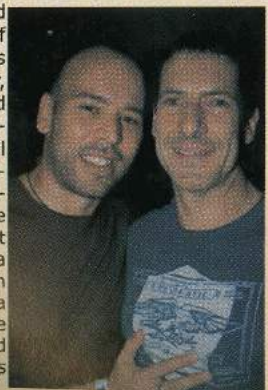

shares his California King with me. And on that subject, our dears, our lips are sealed....



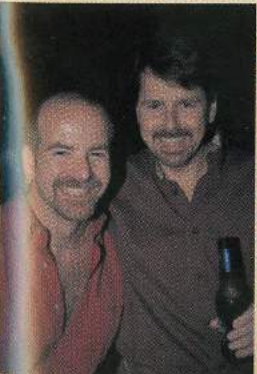
