


Then there's that smart Red Hot Party in Austin next Friday at Austin's OCH. It's a big fundraiser for a great cause and we've got the details for ya right here.



Ledger's Swan Song May Be Finest Performance by Robert Stahl The Dark Knight, the newest installment of the recently resurrected and wildly successful Barman franchise opens next week, and everyone is buzzing about Heath Ledger's performance as the Joker. Will Ledger's death heighten public curiosity, causing the film to be this summer's biggest blockbuster?

In January, the 28-year-old actor's death from an apparent overdose of prescription drugs shocked the nation. A young Hollywood sensation and hearthhrob, Ledger had appeared in films such as The Patriot and A Knight's Tale before winning the respect and admiration of gay fans after his moving performance in Brokeback Mountain. With the completion of the Dark Knight, Ledger seemed poised on the edge of superstandom.

Comic book and movie fans alike began eagerly anticipating Ledger's sinister interpretation of the Joker after trailers for the movie debuted on the internet last year. In the clips, Ledger's Clown Prince of Crime's disturbing and menacing; stringy green disheveled hair atop a deathly chalk-white visage, grim scowltwisted inside a red smear smile. This Joker is cruel, frightening; equal parts Charles Manson and Hannibal Lecter, and very similar in feel to the psychotic antagonist portrayed in Alan Moore's 1988 best selling graphic novel the Killing Joke.

Internet rumors of a posthumous Oscar for



Ledger began swirling after Rolling Stone film editor Peter Travers' critique of the Dark Knight called for Ledger to be honored with the Academy's ultimate trophy. The only other posthumous award in Oscar history was for Peter Finch's role in 1976's the Network. In 2006, Ledger was nominated for his performance in Brokeback Mountain, but did not win.

Before his death, Ledger told reporters that the performance was taking a psychological toll on him. He found himself unable to sleep, and claimed to be emotionally and physically exhausted. Upon hearing of Ledger's passing, Jack Nicholson, who played the Joker in 1989, cryptically remarked, "I warned him."

If pre-sales are any indication, the Dark Knight will be bigger than Indy 4 and Iron Man. According to Fandango, tickets to



the movie's midnight premier sold out three weeks in advance, causing many theaters to tack on a 3am viewing. Fandango also reports that sales for the film in this stage of the sales cycle are tracking stronger than Spider-Man 3, which set records last year for the biggest opening weekend ever.

At Zeus Toys and Comics, fans gobbled up \$90 Joker dolls bearing Ledger's likeness. "We sold out within an hour," said owner Richard Neal, "and I've heard reports of them selling for double at conventions." Neal sees this as a sign that the movie will be huge. "People are talking about the Dark Knight. There seems to be a lot of interest. It's as it Ledger's death, has brought a darker, more sinister edge to the film."



In other words, the site endeavors to make money....which is not a bad thing, certainly, but definitely a tad bit oppressive vis-à-vis the alluded to creativity that was always the hallmark of the blog process. And make money it does, with advertisers as diverse as The New York Times, Netflix, Smucker's, Yellowbook.com, Hertz and Mazda - and with alowing reviews and recommendations from Brazil's top newspapers: Folha de Sao Paulo, O Globo and Jornal do Brasil.

MIB is certainly popular, no doubt about that - heavy-hitters like Hertz and Mazda don't just advertise with ANY gay blog, ya know. But, it's that very popularity that has made it just one more cookie-cutter website appealing to the greatest number of visitors simply to make poucos reals. It's no longer about the quality or the interest of the content - it's about the number of times its primary banner refreshes.



In becoming mainstream enough for The New York Times, however, its creators have removed any appealing information and become simply one more outlet for companies to pursue our disposable income.





It was 17 years ago in the middle of the July heat and Fred & Roy, who were then the owners of OCH, asked Steve Higginbotham to put together some sort of benefit. "I was driving in to work and my A/C was out in the car and all I could think of was heat, so that's really where to RED HOT name came from, " says Steve.

He continues, "I chose Project Transitions for several reasons. It was local. There was no funding for it at the times so they were truly in need, and it was also a project that was near and dear to my partner. And when he passed away this event just took on an even more special place for me."

Project transitions offers transitional housing and support in a compassionate and caring environment serving people with HIV and AIDS. Roosevelt Gardens, Highland Terrace and Community Hous-

ing are transitional housing programs and staff social work-ers help residents apply for permanent

permanent housing and achieve their personal goals.

Higginbotham, who has been a bartender in the gay community for 35 years, started in 1972 fresh out of the Army in New Orleans, came to Texas and managed the Mining Companies in both Dallas and Houston and eventually moved to Austin, where he's been a

fixture for many years at OCH.

As someone who's served millions of drinks to thousands of loyal customers in his career, he shares his lament at the great loss we have suffered at the hands of HIV, noting that a huge percentage of his friends and customers seemed to just vanish in a matter of months back in the early days.

Last year, Steve points out, RED HOT hit the quarter million dollar mark and he's extremely excited about what's already happening this year. "We even got a check for 2000 dollars from WALmart this year!" He exclaims.

The party starts on Friday the 18th at 5PM with a silent auction from 5-9, the Austin Babtist Women will also be on hand, and so will the cast from "Altar Boys." They will also be auctioning off dates with some OCH's hottie bartenders. Then of course there's that LAVISH buffet.

Steve notes that this year's Red Hot is in Memory of former OCH entrepreneur Fred Fine and Pierce Runnels, who had been instrumental in the event for many years.
