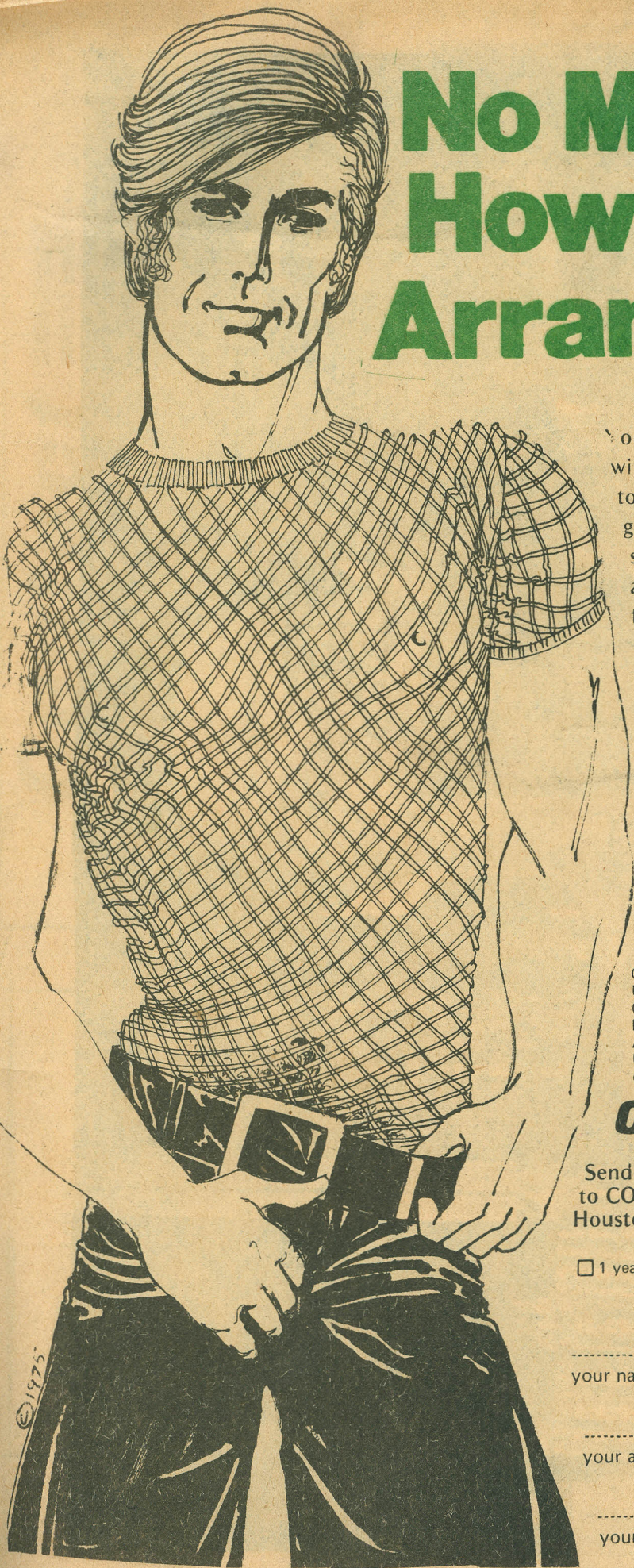

HPD SECRET FILES: NO WORD ON GAYS YET

HOUSTON — No indication has emerged yet that gay activists or gay individuals as such were among the "hundreds and hundreds of people" who were the subjects of undercover investigations under the regime of former Police Chief Herman Short, the mayor's office told CONTACT.

However, this is only because so little is known about what is contained in the police files and about exactly who were the targets of the surveillance by the police Criminal Intelligence Division.

"There are whole file cabinets full of index cards that no one has looked through," said Barbara Strong, press secretary to Mayor Fred Hofheinz.

In his limited public statements about the police files, Hofheinz has confirmed that the socially and politically prominent subject's sex lives were one of the items brought under police scrutiny.

More information about the contents of the files is expected to be revealed by a blue-ribbon commission appointed by Hofheinz Jan. 13 and headed by Spurgeon Bell, retired chief judge of the First Court of Civil Appeals who now teaches at South Texas School of Law in Houston.

Mayor Hofheinz said he has examined the dossiers of only three of the many people investigated, one of them U.S. Rep. Barbara Poff of Houston — and he emphatically added that her sex life was not discussed in her police file.

Hofheinz told reporters that he did not want to see the dossiers of any more individuals for fear of invading the subjects' privacy.

Houston newspapers and broadcast stations have reported that the prominent parties investigated include people active in a variety of

political, social-protest, anti-war and civil liberties causes, as well as many workers on Hofheinz's campaign for mayor. Also dossered are religious leaders, politically active individuals and members of the news media, including at least one Houston newspaper editor.

Meanwhile, Ms. Strong revealed to CONTACT that the Houston police, under the new leadership of Chief Carrol M. Lynn, has shut off access to the confidential files by other police agencies in Texas and across the country.

She said the decision to close the files to other agencies was announced within the Houston department Jan. 13 by Capt. B.G. (Pappy) Bond, the new head of the criminal investigation division.

The files were characterized as "unsubstantiated hearsay from unidentified people" by Joan Glanz, executive administrator of the Texas Civil Liberties Union.

The Texas CLU has filed a \$5-million class-action law suit against the city on behalf of the hundreds of people who were secretly investigated.

Other suits have been filed by alleged targets of the police probes who contend that the police libellously used the files against them, showing them to employers and others.

The Texas CLU is also suing to keep the police files from being turned over to the Bell commission for examination. Ms. Glanz explained that "no citizen has the right to go through them, not even the mayor." She added the implication that the only use for them now is scrutiny to see if the police violated wiretapping or other laws in compiling the

dossiers.

Ms. Glanz confirmed that there is no indication so far that gay people were any special target of the police surveillance.

The question about gays being subjects of the police interest was raised by the mayor's reference to recording data on the subjects' sexual habits, and by a reference to gay liberation groups being among those considered politically subversive, in a report filed by an agent of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

The state agency's secret investigations are known to have included surveillance of former State Rep. Curtis Graves of Houston and of Leon Williams, who ran against powerful House Appropriations Committee Chairman William E. Heatly in the 1970 primary.

The report on Graves, a controversial black, was secretly circulated at the State Capitol after Graves began open criticism of House Speaker Gus F. Mutscher, before Mutscher's indictment and conviction in a bank-stock scheme.

Williams lost his Chamber of Commerce job after he filed against the Appropriations Committee chairman.

Also probed by the state agency was Robert W. Pomeroy of Dallas, a pilot for Continental Airlines who came under scrutiny after he led the formation of a citizens group opposing construction of a new nuclear power plant near Dallas.

Wilson E. Speir, director of the Texas agency, assured Gov. Dolph Briscoe that the state reports were all prepared at the request of "responsible" state officials and law enforcement agencies, and that none were shown to other than "bona fide law enforcement agencies."

A copy of Pomeroy's dossier was shown to his employer, however.

NEW ORLEANS — Mardi Gras, which means "Fat Tuesday," is intrinsically oriented with the season of Lent. It is the last day before Lent begins and is the high point of "Carnival." Derived from Latin meaning "Farewell to the Flesh," it's a time for masquerades, parties, balls, parades and celebrations of all kinds before the fasting and penitence begins.

For gay people, Mardi Gras has come to many to mean "the annual trip to New Orleans."

Officially, the Carnival Season begins on the Feast of the Epiphany, which is January 6, the Twelfth Night after Christmas. This is the day the Three Kings were said to have visited the Christ Child and recognized Him as the Messiah.

Carnival ends at midnight before Ash Wednesday, and early the next morning the lines of penitents are formed at the churches for them to receive the cross of ashes on their foreheads.

This year Mardi Gras Day falls on February 11th.

In 1857, the first of the famous Carnival organizations came into being. It was the Mystick Krewe of Comus — a group of gentlemen who got together in a purely private way to entertain their friends with a party and to please the people of New Orleans with a glamorous street parade. Rex, King of Carnival, whose parade takes place on Mardi Gras morning, held his first reign in 1872. The Knights of Momus made their debut the same year. Other Krewes soon came into existence, each with its special parade and ball date.

Gay Krewes have been formed over the past dozen years, but so far none of them stage a parade. They all, however, do hold their private balls.

Mardi Gras is not limited to New Orleans, of course. Many southern cities hold parades and balls of their own. This year, the Krewe of Zeus in Lake Charles, an all-gay Krewe, is holding their second annual ball at the Lake Charles Civic Center. This is considered quite a social achievement for a gay Krewe in a southern city of only 145,000 population.

In New Orleans for two weeks preceding Mardi Gras, there are parades almost every day, and sometimes several. On Mardi Gras day more than a million people see the great parade of Rex, followed by the other smaller Krewes. Gays have traditionally gathered in the 800 and 900 blocks of Bourbon for the annual costume awards held jointly by Cafe Lafittes In Exile and the Clover Grill. The photo on the front cover is of the gay crowd at last year's awards on Mardi Gras day.

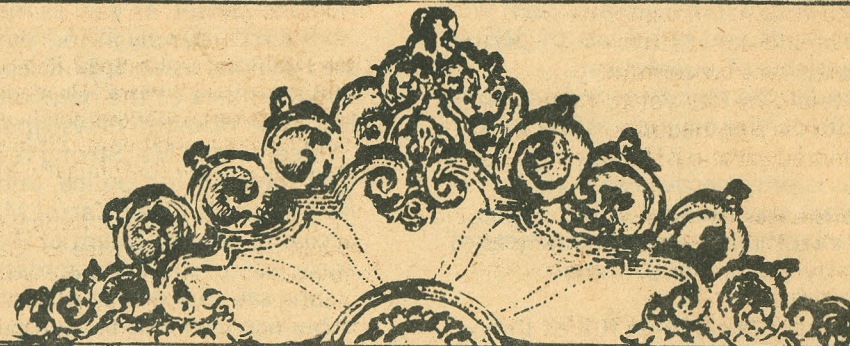

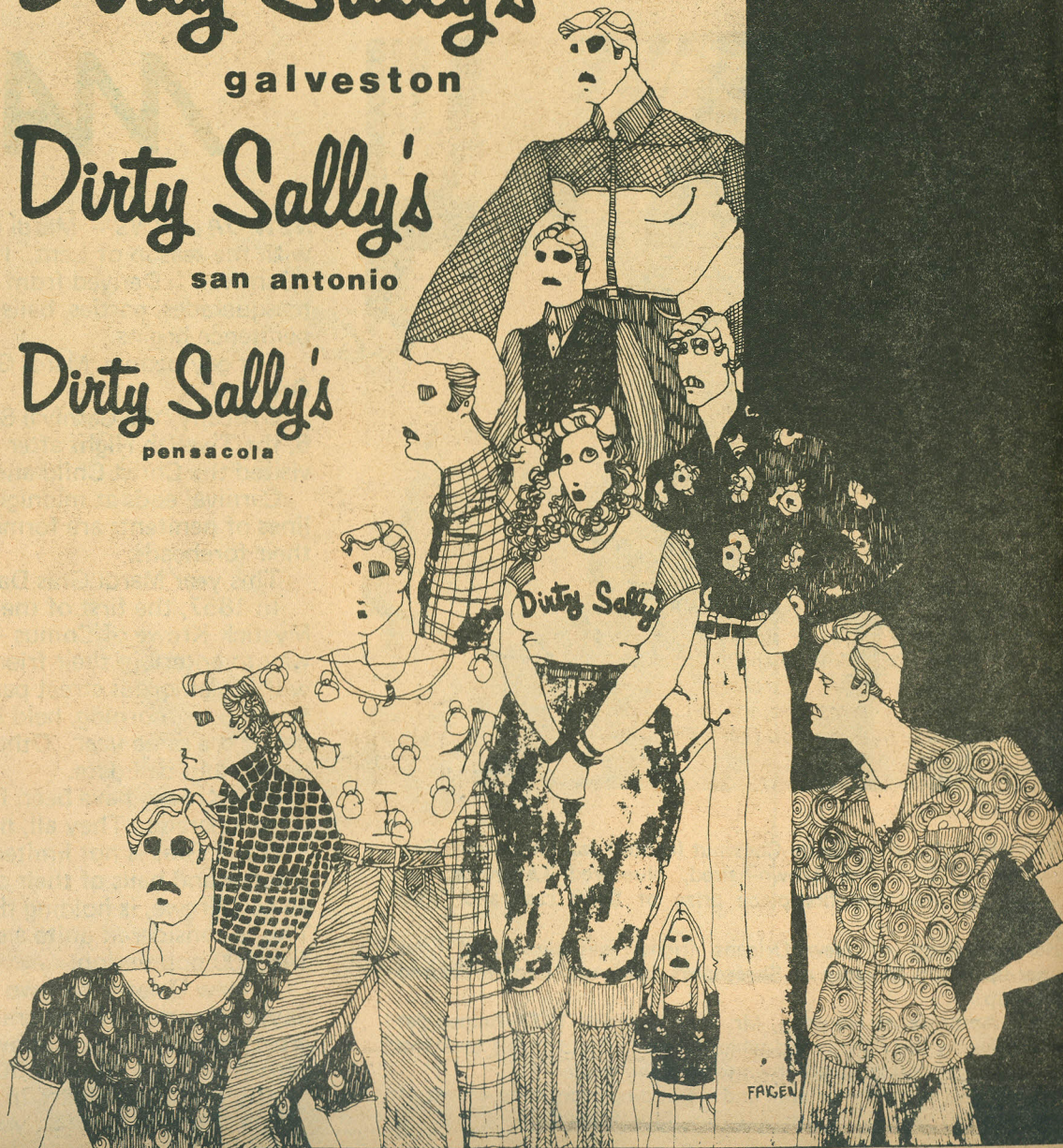

SPEAR SUPPORTED FOR COMING OUT

MINNEAPOLIS — State Sen. Allan Spear returned home from a Christmas vacation to Mexico Dec. 30 to find his mailbox stuffed, mostly with letters and cards from well-wishers who congratulated him on coming out.

In fact, Spear said he has yet to receive much criticism at all for having become, on Dec. 9, the nation's first elected public official to come out as gay.

The announcement was carried across the front page of the *Minneapolis Star*, Minnesota's largest afternoon paper, in a story below the headline, "State Sen. Allan Spear Declares He's Homosexual."

Said Spear, "I'm really gratified by the kind of response it got, both from gay people and from the folks I know in politics. I feel very good about it."

Spear counted 76 letters and telegrams received up to that point, only five or six of them at all negative, usually enclosing Bible tracts. "And the letters with the tracts were usually kind ones, telling me how sorry they were that I'm condemned to hell unless I become straight. They were sorrowful, good people, not hateful at all," he said.

Spear, 37, is a part-time associate professor of Afro-American history at the University of Minnesota, a

space in New York, Washington, Los Angeles, Detroit, Pittsburgh, San Francisco and Houston papers — as well as in *Der Spiegel*, the German newsweekly.

It was not exactly a shock in Minneapolis political circles, however, for Spear had been inching out of the closet for several years. He made a point of informing many campaign workers and key supporters in 1972 before he ran, and he was often seen, during and after the campaign, at Sutton Place, a large gay bar in downtown Minneapolis.

A year ago he took a leading role in the founding of the Minnesota Committee for Gay Rights, which seeks to become a large, popularly based organization with both gay and straight membership mounting a many-fronts campaign of education and political action. Since June he has served as co-chairperson.

Spear was not exactly deep in the closet, then, and "everyone around the Capitol and the actively political people knew it anyway," he conceded.

Spear was concerned about coming out publicly, however, for fear that he would become known only as a gay senator, that fact overshadowing his views and votes

on taxes, housing, etc., "that my stands will be filtered through others' perceptions of me as a gay person," he said.

His decision to come out in December was triggered in part, he said, by the election Nov. 5 of Elaine Noble to the legislature in Massachusetts. "When she won, it made me feel a little less lonely," Spear said.

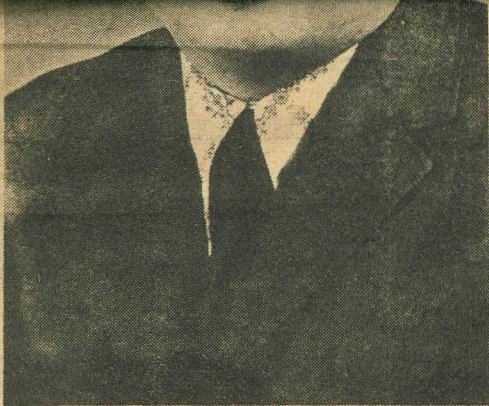
Spear's Christmas trip to Mexico was to see his parents, who have retired from the small-town Indiana home where they raised Spear.

"They were a little surprised, and stunned too, when I showed them the article in the *Star* — until I showed them the first batch of letters I had received, and all the good things that were said," Spear related.

Only a year ago he told his parents that he's gay. "I never thought I could tell them," he said, and found them just as shocked as he had feared.

But they were supportive, too. "Mama said a lovely thing. She said it used to be that such a thing would have been horrible. More recently, she said she would have felt sorry for someone who was sick, but, 'Allan,' she said, 'I don't think you're sick.'"





veteran of anti-war marches and radical causes who was elected to his first four-year term in the Minnesota House in 1972. His district is dominated by the huge, 43,000-student campus, but includes conservative blue-collar neighborhoods on either side of it. Politically it is overwhelmingly Democratic-Farmer-Laborite, and it was Sen. George McGovern's coattails that carried DF Ler Spear through in 1972 against a popular Republican liberal.

Thus Spear was especially gratified to receive a congratulatory telephone call Dec. 13 from Gov. Wendell R. Anderson.

"The governor said he wanted me to know he admired my courage in doing what I did, and that it would make no difference in our political relationship — that I've done a good job as a senator and that he'll support me for re-election," said Spear.

It was quite a statement for the governor, a handsome, well-muscled alumnus of the U.S. Olympic hockey team who has been close-mouthed on gay issues since his election in 1970. In 1973 an aide to the governor made the mistake of trying to lobby Spear, of all people, to vote against a gay rights bill in the Senate. Anderson himself repeatedly refused gay activists' requests for interviews until last June, when he told reporters, and gay representatives, that he had decided to support at least a weak gay job-rights bill in the 1975 legislative session.

During gay-rights debate in 1973, Spear felt he had to remain silent on the Senate floor. "I don't want to go through that again," Spear told the *Star*. "I felt lousy."

This year he'll definitely speak up for the bill — as a gay senator.

Spear's announcement in the *Star* was carried around the nation by the AP and UPI wire services, earning

BAKER & IRS FIGHT ON

MINNEAPOLIS — Gay lovers Jack Baker and J. Michael McConnell filed an appeal Dec. 31 from a U.S. Internal Revenue Service ruling that their 1971 marriage does not entitle them to file a joint income-tax return as a married couple.

The quirk is that in insisting that the IRS recognize the validity of their marriage, the 32-year-old Minneapolis men must also insist on the right to pay \$307.77 more in taxes than the IRS says they owe.

The reason for the higher tax is that both men work: Baker, a lawyer, was a gay-liberation lecturer and student consultant in 1972 and 1973, the years at issue. McConnell, his lover since 1967, is a librarian with the county library system in Minneapolis.

And while married couples are taxed at a lower percentage rate than single people with the same income. Baker and McConnell's combined income, \$11,592 in 1973, pushes them into a higher tax bracket as a married couple than either would pay on his income alone, even under the higher rates levied on singles.

In any event, the income-tax appeal sets the stage for a whole new chapter in the celebrated lovers' lengthy public battle to put the focus of gay liberation on a simple issue that everyone can understand: love and marriage.

The legal machinations are far more complex, however.

The marriage-go-round began in May, 1970, when the two men appeared at the Minneapolis courthouse to apply for a marriage license. News photos of the two of them, their hands raised to take the license oath, were published around the world. The courthouse clerk sought legal counsel and declined to issue the license, at which Baker and McConnell sued to force him to. Minnesota law nowhere says that marrying couples must be one man and one woman, they argued.

It took almost 1½ years before the Minnesota Supreme Court issued the final ruling — no, they could not have the license, not because of anything the state marriage law said, but because of what it implied about male-female marriages, the court said.

In the interim, the Board of Regents at the University of Minnesota had discovered that McConnell was seeking a library job there, and they turned him

down because of the marriage publicity. McConnell and the American Civil Liberties Union sued and won; the university appealed and was sustained, in an appeals ruling handed down the same week as the marriage decision. And Baker got himself elected student body president at the university, riding a wave of student backlash against the regents.

And Baker set about another strategy to get married. Early in 1971 McConnell arranged to adopt Baker — unusual, perhaps, but certainly legal. In the process Baker's name was changed to Pat Lyn McConnell.

Then the two men applied for, and received, a marriage license for James Michael and Pat Lyn McConnell at Mankato, Minn., 75 miles from Minneapolis. On the basis of that license they were married by a United Methodist minister Sept. 3, 1971 — six weeks before the Supreme Court ruled they could not insist on being given a marriage license in Minneapolis.

It is over the Mankato license, and the marriage performed on it, that the current controversy will revolve. No court has ever ruled on the validity of that license and the marriage, they argue. And the Supreme Court's decision on the Minneapolis license request has no bearing on the status of the marriages performed before that decision was handed down.

A 38-page legal brief filed in conjunction with their IRS appeal develops their argument fully. They cite a 1926 Minnesota court ruling that said a teen-age marriage cannot be invalidated just because the young couple lied about their age because they were too young to marry legally; the court said the liars are legally wed.

Baker and McConnell also cite the 1911 state court decision on the many marriages of a bigamist named Claude Yoder. Yoder divorced his first wife, then remarried her without waiting six months, as state law requires. Before long Yoder married a second woman — without bothering to divorce his first wife again. Prosecuted for bigamy, Yoder argued that his second marriage was invalid, because of the ignored six-month wait. Not so, the Supreme Court declared; the marriage may have been illegally performed, but once performed, it is valid.

Baker and McConnell use similar logic in arguing the validity of their marriage, and they note forcefully that the IRS has no authority to rule on the validity of marriages. it is valid.

They also allege that to refuse to recognize their marriage denies them equal protection of the law, and amounts to discrimination on the basis of sex, for the marriage would go unquestioned if either man were female.

It will take, Baker estimates, two years or so for the IRS appeals system to be exhausted, and that may include an entry into federal court to argue the case.

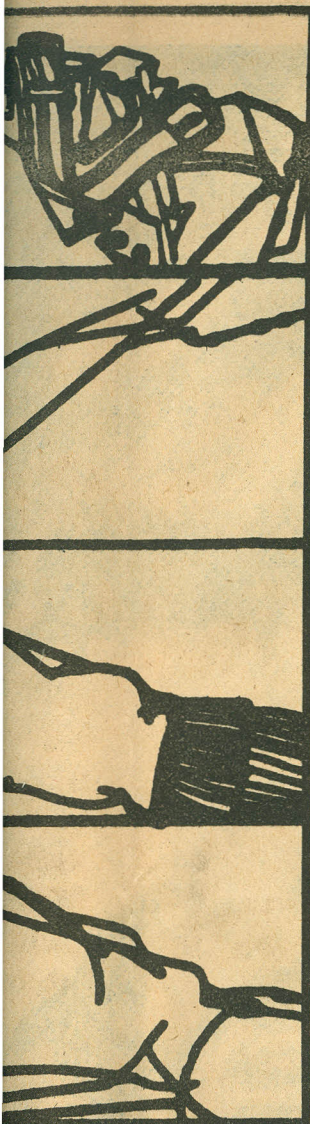
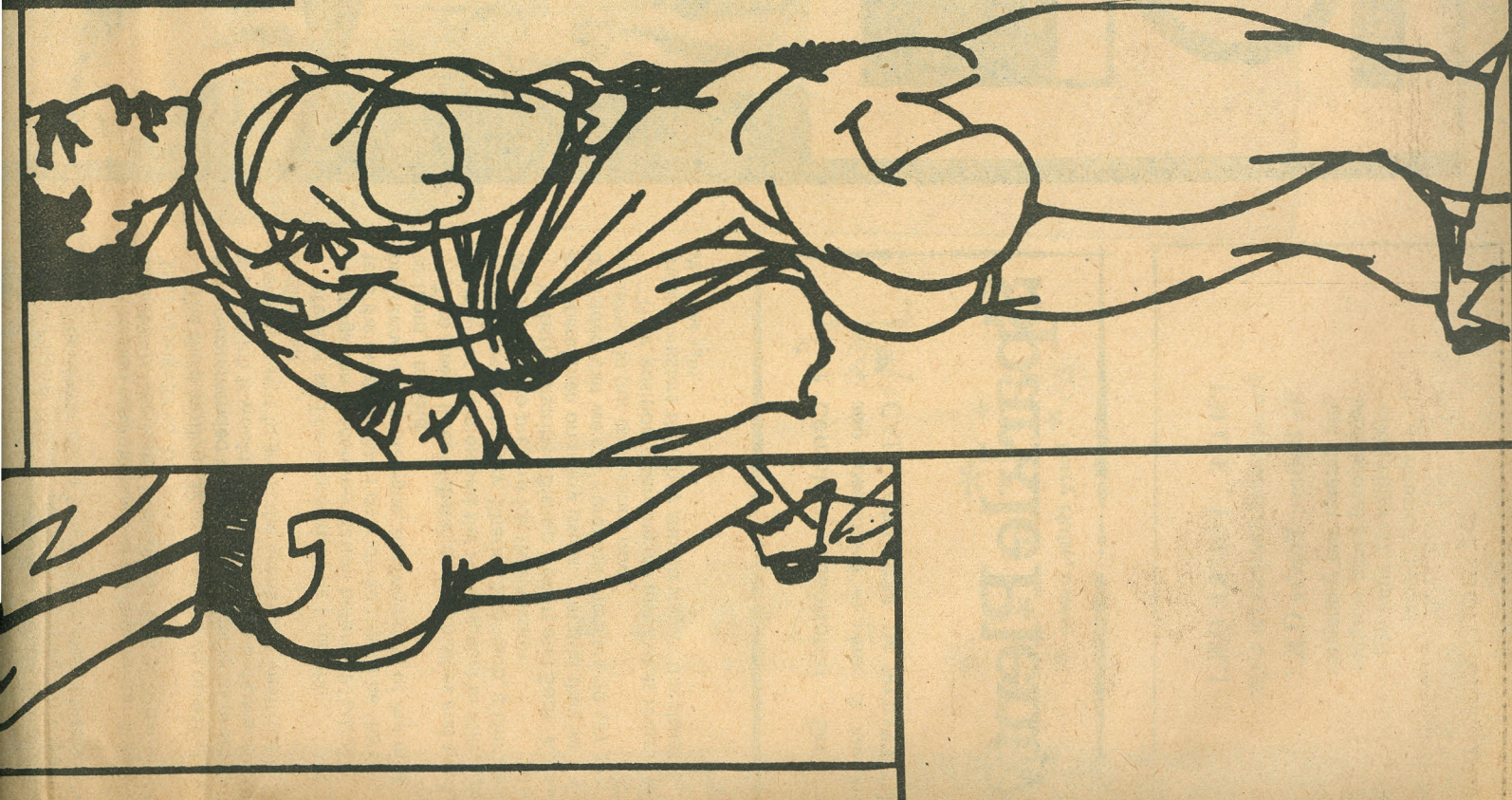

GAY FIGHTS TO BE METHODIST MINISTER

MADISON, Wis. — A 23-year-old gay man considers his setback at the hands of his local congregation only a temporary one in his bid to become a minister of the United Methodist Church.

And Steven E. Webster vowed to continue his personal ministry in his parish with every hope of being successful in 1975.

The vote at the Dec. 8 annual meeting of University United Methodist Church was 32 to 19 in favor of recommending a "license to preach" for Webster. A switch of only two votes would have given him the two-thirds margin he needed to win this crucial support for entering the Methodist ministry.

Webster, who graduated from the University of Wisconsin and has been active in the local gay movement, said he still plans to enroll at Garrett Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill., next September.

"Our Wisconsin Conference's Task Force on the Church and the Gay Liberation Movement, and its counterpart within our congregation, will be holding a lot of forums and discussions about gay people in the next few months, that's for sure," Webster said after the vote.

The heavy support for him displayed at the parish meeting came despite the declared opposition to ordaining an openly gay minister from Bishop Jesse DeWitt of the Wisconsin Conference and from the Rev. Bernard Kassilke, superintendent of the Madison district.

The reason they cite is appointability — the argument that an openly gay minister would be difficult to place in a parish position. The question is significant because the United Methodist Church guarantees an appointment for every minister on its rolls.

And, while bishops in theory have the power to appoint any minister to any pulpit they choose, in practice they listen closely to the needs and desires

expressed by each congregation.

"The superintendent, and the other leaders who know me, admit that I'm fully qualified for the ministry, and they say there's no theological problem to ordaining a gay person," Webster said. "But in the United Methodist Church ordination means you have to be qualified for a parish, whether you ever serve one or not."

Thus, Webster's challenge is different from that posed to the United Church of Christ in 1972 by the Rev. William R. Johnson of San Francisco. After a spirited debate Mr. Johnson became the nation's first openly gay man to be ordained in a Protestant denomination, but he was called by a church agency, not a parish. And the bulk of Mr. Johnson's service (until Jan. 1, when he resigned) has been to the Council on Religion and the Homosexual, Inc.

However, because the appointability issue, the Texas and Illinois conference of the United Methodist Church have revoked the credentials of the two ministers whose gayness became public in recent years.

Webster attributed at least part of the strength of his support in Madison to the weakness in Wisconsin of the Good News Caucus, a fundamentalist Methodist group which is seizing on the issue of "ordaining homosexual ministers" in opposing the generally liberal leadership of the 12-million-member denomination across the country.

Webster has been active in his Methodist parish for five years, ever since he enrolled at the university in Madison. Appointed a member (delegate) to the state convention in 1973, he came out at the 1974 convention by asking that the church commit itself to a ministry to gay women and men. "I got a lot of support," he said, as the motion passed easily, and a gay task force was created in the conference shortly afterward.

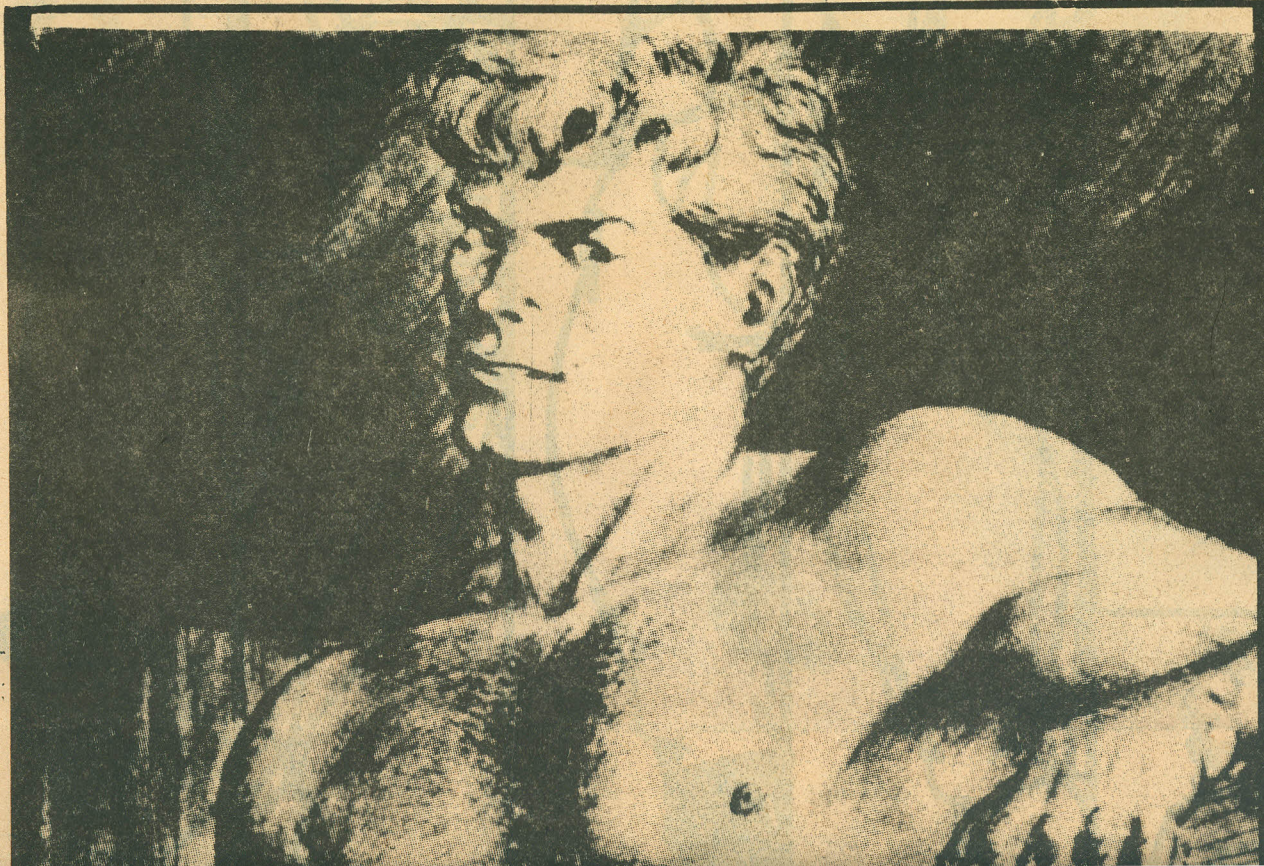
Nor did Webster's announcement deter his pastor, the Rev. H. Myron Talcott, from arranging for Webster to deliver the sermon last Aug. 4, during Mr. Talcott's vacation.

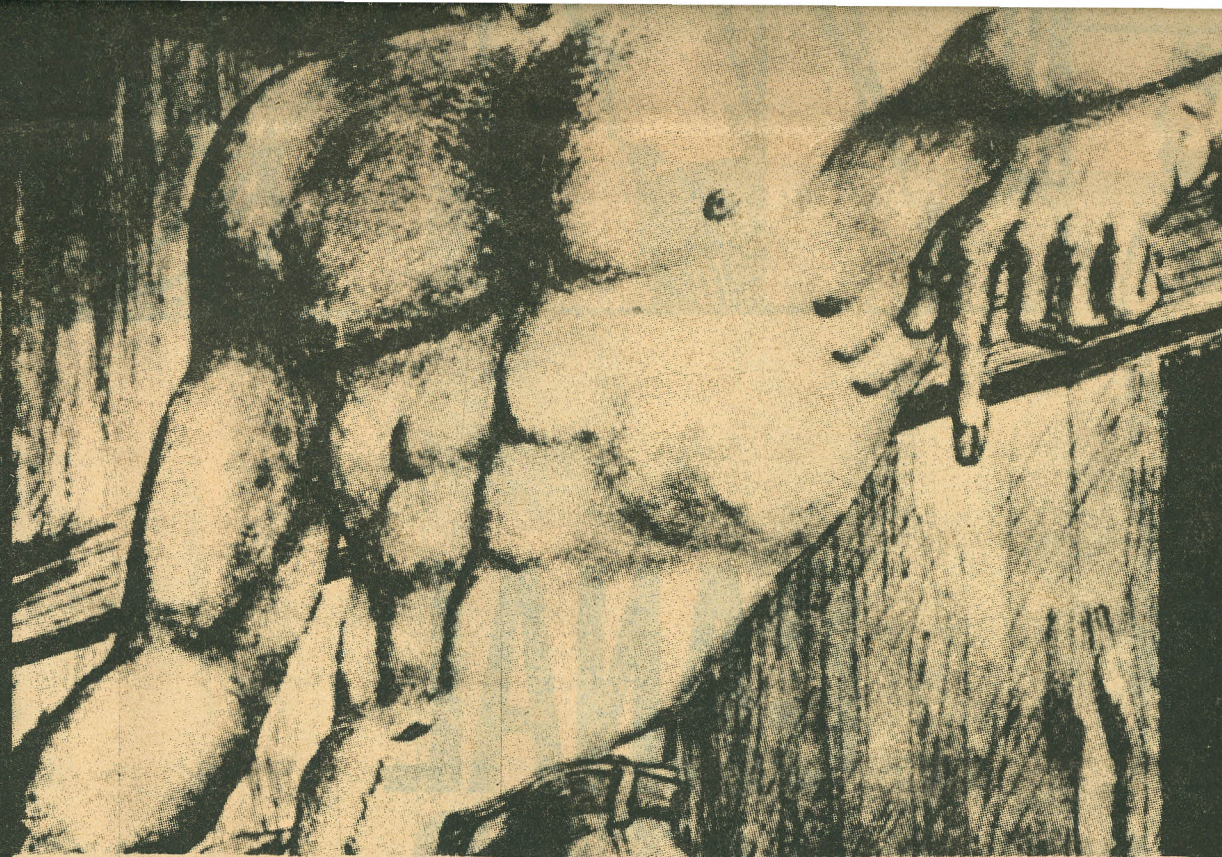

Webster said he is confident he'll get the congregation's recommendation before 1975 is out. "I told the meeting that I considered this to be the very beginning of our dialogue, the beginning of my mission to them," he said.

Two weeks later Webster met with allies and the Council for Religion and the Homosexual in Milwaukee — its president is the Rev. Charles Schinlaub, a United Methodist — to prepare for that mission.

Webster described Bishop DeWitt and Supt. Kassilke as "liberal men on many issues. I'm told they've conceded that we can't pretend there are no gay ministers in our conference now.

"Their position regarding me just makes it clear to those ministers that they should stay in the closet," Webster said.

Unitarians Name Gay

BOSTON — Arlie Scott of New York City has been appointed to the staff of the new Office of Gay Concerns of the Unitarian-Universalist Association.

The office, being funded at the annual rate of \$38,000, is the first exclusively gay-oriented agency within any American denomination. Its creation was approved by the church's General Assembly at its annual meeting last June.

Ms. Scott, a former Los Angeles resident, once served on the board of directors of the National Organization for Women. Her appointment to the church post was cleared by the church headquarters with the Advisory Committee of the Unitarian-Universalist Gay Caucus, which had lobbied for creation of the office.

Ms. Scott will work under Norman Benson, director of the church's Office of Social Concerns in the denomination's Boston headquarters. A man is also to be appointed to the Office of Gay Concerns, and while interviewing has begun, it was not immediately clear when an appointment would be made.

Joseph Norton of Latham, N.Y., coordinator of the Gay Caucus, said the Office of Gay Concerns is supposed to educate the church membership about gay people, provide direct service to gay members and spark research about the status of gay people within the denomination.

But it will not be an office of the Gay Caucus itself, he added. "Our caucus will remain a separate entity, serving as a watchdog on the office, handling referrals and being supportive and advisory," Norton said.

Creation of the new office was originally approved by the 1973 General Assembly, with funds to be recruited outside the church's annual budget. No such funds were forthcoming, however, until a \$600,000 bequest to the denomination was announced about a year ago. In parceling out the funds from the bequest last June, the General Assembly designated \$38,000 for the Office of Gay Concerns.

That appropriation was sustained by a 12-to-11 vote in October by the church's Board of Trustees, over the vehement opposition of Dr. Robert Nelson West, president of the denomination.

Dr. Nelson argued that \$38,000 was too much to spend on behalf of one select group within the church — a position he argued with such enthusiasm as to lead some observers, Norton said, to conclude that Dr. West is "madly homophobic."

Broshears Calls Movie Boycotts

SAN FRANCISCO — The West Coast Gay Liberation Front has asked gay people to act in opposition to two new Hollywood movies that it contends holds sexual minorities up to ridicule.

The San Francisco organization, which is identified with the Rev. Ray Broshears, said the current film, *Freddie and the Bean*, is "badly made The main character is a transvestite and . . . the San Francisco Police Department is made to look like vicious, sick animals and the transvestites are treated as freaks and worse." The group suggested that the film be boycotted.

Heavier criticism was directed at the soon-to-be-released Al Pacino movie, *Dog Day Afternoon*, calling it "the most anti-gay film yet made . . . the sexploitation is sickening."

Rev. Broshears' group asked that legal means be used to stop the film from being played in movie theaters, alleging that the \$3.5-million epic "exploits transsexuals and gay people as well, and holds them up to ridicule."

Conference Ends

EDINBURGH, Scotland — It's time for the world's churches to make a major effort to understand gay women and men better than in the past, the First International Gay Rights Congress declared Dec. 22.

"There is no denying that the homosexual woman and man feels alienated from other Christians," declared a resolution adopted at the end of the five-day meeting.

"We have the capacity for full and loving relationships.

"The church must acknowledge this fact and encourage the homosexual to live life fully and faithfully," said the convention, in approving a statement drafted by its religion workshop.

The measure praised the understanding attitude displayed by the Dutch churches, noted the Anglican decision to form a 12-member working party on attitudes toward gay people, and cited the World Council of Churches' new study of sexual minorities as examples for other churches to follow.

Houston Transsexual Granted Guardianship

HOUSTON — A 16-year-old boy who says he wants a transsexual operation has been placed by court authorities under the guardianship of Anne Mayes of TRACS of Houston.

Ms. Mayes, who underwent transsexual surgery in January 1974, said the teen-ager moved into her home in December, the same day the guardianship was approved in Harris County Juvenile Court.

"He's back in school now for the first time in months," Ms. Mayes told CONTACT in January. "He's doing fine, making a fantastic adjustment.

"For the first time in years, he has a goal in life — to go to college and, eventually, to have a sex change."

Following the practice of the Juvenile Court, the youth's name was withheld from publication, along with any other information that would tend to identify him. The boy's probation officer also asked CONTACT not to discuss details of the situation in the lad's parental home.

Ms. Mayes said the 16-year-old came to the attention of the Juvenile Probation Department after his arrest some months ago on a misdemeanor charge, an offense that occurred during some weeks of drifting after the youth moved out of his parental home.

That period in his life was pretty aimless, she said, as the youth crashed with first one set of friends, then sought hospitality from others. He dropped out of school.

"He wasn't like the typical delinquent we see down here," the youth's probation officer told CONTACT. "He wasn't swishy at all, either — but very poised, graceful and fully at home with himself. He's vibrant, exuberant and full of energy."

It was the Crisis Hotline that referred the Probation Department to Ms. Mayes' Testing Research and Counseling Service Inc., and a rigorous two-month investigation of Ms. Mayes and TRACS followed.

"Frankly, I had never heard of transsexuals before, and before Crises mentioned them, I had never heard of TRACS," the probation officer said.

Ms. Mayes said, "I told them I'd be willing to see the child, and I added if they could not succeed in finding a home for him elsewhere, I'd take him."

In December in Juvenile Court, that is exactly what the Probation Department recommended.

Their recommendation was supported by written findings of two clinical psychologists who advise TRACS,

Dr. James McCary and Dr. Jerome Sherman, tentatively identifying the youth as probably a male transsexual.

After the guardianship was approved, the 16-year-old also entered the TRACS evaluation program.

Terms of the youth's probation require, however, that he not dress in women's clothes as he has done openly for two to three years, since that is a violation of Houston city ordinance. Probation requires observing all


laws.

Other than that, Ms. Mayes said the 16-year-old is "doing fine and, as I said, making a fantastic adjustment.

"For once, he has the ambition to do something with his life, rather than just wandering around the streets."

Ms. Mayes praised "the tremendous effort of the juvenile court and the Probation Department in taking the boy's interest to heart."

1st Open Gay Admitted To District Of Columbia Bar

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Joseph Stewart was sworn in Dec. 19 as a member of the District of Columbia bar, becoming the first open gay to win the right to practice law in the nation's capital.

Stewart, 27, is one of three men who are challenging the constitutionality of the D.C. sodomy law in federal court — Stewart as the result of an arrest last April by two plainclothes policemen who contend they observed him in an act of oral sex with another man in the paths along the C&O Canal in Washington.

Stewart was acquitted in September of another charge, simple assault, brought against him by a policeman, whose presence in the C&O Canal cruising area was noted by Stewart one day last summer, prompting Stewart to warn other Gays in the area. Stewart contended in court that it was the policeman who assaulted him, not the other way around.

Bar requirements call for all applicants to "be of good

moral character," and Stewart solicited some forty letters attesting to his good character from lawyers, priests, journalists and business associates — all of them aware of the two criminal charges and all of them avowing that Stewart is honest and moral in his daily dealings with them.

Stewart said he informed the bar Admissions Committee that he is "an avowed homosexual" and secured legal help with the expectation of taking his cause to the U.S. Supreme Court, if necessary.

But the only question raised by the Admissions

Committee, Stewart said, dealt with details of a 1970 conviction for possession of a smattering of marijuana — a conviction that was set aside and officially expunged after six months probation, the new lawyer said.

Stewart, a Volunteers in Service to America worker since March 1974 in a poverty legal-services agency in Washington, said he is drafting plans to open a gay legal services and research center some months from now. He said he will continue as CONTACT's Washington correspondent, in addition to his law practice with VISTA.

AMA Rejects Sodomy Repeal

PORTLAND, Oreg. — The American Medical Association rejected a recommendation by its leaders that it come out for repeal of sodomy and other laws controlling consenting adults.

But the reason delegates made clear, is that they are concerned about appearing to condone prostitution, not about letting gay adults do their thing in private.

The question brought before the AMA's annual clinical session Dec. 3 was whether to approve the American Law Institute's model penal code, which does not outlaw private consensual sex between adults.

The measure had been endorsed by the AMA's board of trustees, but the delegates referred it back to the board by a vote of 112 to 90.

A year ago the AMA's Council on Mental Health released a recommendation declaring that being gay "denotes no inherent impairment in physical or mental capacity for social or vocational adaptation." The delegates have not approved that position yet, either.

Yes . . . I can see it now. Former Houston Police Chief Herman Short conducting a campaign to bring in new recruits. Oh, the good ole' days:

The Houston Police Department needs 2000 new faces! Do YOU qualify?

Applicants should have the ability to squint and squat for long periods of time in unusual (often damp and cramped) locations. Those with "piercing" eyes given immediate acceptance.

Preference given to applicants with close friends at Southwestern Bell. (Perverts and politicians not welcome, since Chief Short "does not talk to queers in my office."* Barbara Jordan, Bob Casey and Fred Hofheinz also need not apply.)

Call City Hall during regular business hours. Please talk slow and distinct (and pay no attention to those occasional clicks on the line . . . also pay no attention to occasional clicks on your line several weeks later).

The Houston Police Department spying scandal. The solution is not just to **prevent** certain officials from doing it again. The solution is to **educate** those officials that what they were doing — spying by legal and illegal

methods on citizens just in case they committed a crime — is illegal.

I don't think that those officers involved really thought they were doing wrong . . . doing something against the basic grain of American justice. I think they probably thought they were doing the **right** thing.

This is why **education** is necessary. Courses at the Police Academy should not only teach that running a red light is illegal . . . they should teach basic American freedom concepts. Philosophy should be taught. Recruits which appear not to grasp the concepts should be dropped.

Of course the spying adventure originated high up . . . much higher than the recruits. But where can you start?

Our support goes to City Councilman Jim McConn and to the ACLU in their efforts to bring the full incident to light. Our support also goes to Mayor Hofheinz for revealing the initial facts, but we think Hofheinz should have revealed a little bit more information a little bit sooner. In fact, he should have revealed all he knows about the affair, rather than just a dab here and there.

*In 1972, Chief Short was quoted as saying to a Houston radio newsmen, "I don't talk to queers in my office," after refusing a request from Toni Mayes, a transsexual, for a meeting.

A New Friend.

An important new publication directed at gay readers made its appearance in January, and CONTACT wishes to extend a warm hand of welcome to it.

Published in Los Angeles, the new periodical carries a name that will be familiar to many of our readers, *The Advocate*. And over the seven years of its success, *The Advocate* has earned the respect and gratitude of the entire gay community for its accurate, reliable and enterprising news reports from California and across the nation. The gay movement could not have flourished so quickly without the invaluable resource *The Advocate* so reliably provided.

It is a new publication which bowed this month, however. Gone from the masthead are the names of Dick Michaels and his lover, Bill Rand, who launched *The Advocate* from their basement seven years ago. Trained in technical journalism, Michaels insisted on the high quality of reporting that has become synonymous with the name of his publication.

Missing also from the new *Advocate's* roster is the name of former Texan Rob Cole, who almost single-handedly built the news coverage to its pre-eminent position in the gay press. He easily deserves the title of the nation's No. 1 gay journalist.

And we hear reports that Doug Sariff, Minneapolis-born and Tulsa-trained, whose incisive and well-written news reports have been one of the Los Angeles paper's most memorable features, is also leaving *The Advocate's* full-time staff.

The new publication is owned by David Goodstein, a San Francisco millionaire who has already used his enormous assets to the good of the gay movement in that city. Although the gay movement has not often drawn the interest of men whose political philosophy is so conservative as Goodstein's, it could use more people who demonstrate the quality of his commitment.

Goodstein's new editor is John Preston, 29, who described himself in the *Los Angeles Free Press* as a marxist who is eager to get about the job of creating an improved publication. We have heard much that is impressive about Preston's formidable accomplishments as an activist within the gay community in Minnesota, and we predict he will provide some fresh ideas and perhaps an entirely new definition of what a gay publication can be. He is not, however, an experienced journalist, nor is Goodstein.

CONTACT thinks this is vitally important, perhaps the most significant aspect of their new publication. For while *The Advocate's* new leadership has impressive

resources and high commitment, it does not have the rich background in journalism that gave their publication its reputation, circulation and readership. Thus, regardless of editorial intentions, *The (new) Advocate* cannot maintain the same respected publication that Michaels, Cole and others produced over so many years.

CONTACT remains committed to reporting the news. We will present it as attractively as we can, and include photos and features we think our readers enjoy. But we see the essence of our calling, we define a major need of gay people, as a reliable, accurate and respected source of news. To that end we humbly renew our commitment.
