\$10,400.00 REWARD IN GAY CLUB FIRES

BULLSEYE FIRE -ARSON? - ACCIDENT?

The Bullseye Club at 1212 Westheimer burned early Monday A.M. August 17. The club was opened July 18 this year by Richard Caldwell a newcomer to the Houston club circuit.

The building was owned by Sybil Leek, well known "witch" who had recently moved from this location to Houston's West University area. Sybil Leek, after having spent a great deal in the decoration and remodeling at this site, moved because "she had bad vibrations at this place."

This was the first dinner club for the Gay Set in our city and fast becoming one of the more popular dining and drinking spots.

August 21st, less than one week after this loss Richard was looking for another location to re-open. This sounds like two pervious persons recently experiencing this same misfortune.

Gene Howell, co-owner of the Plantation Club on West Gray was burned out. Relocated on Montrose and Chelsea Place and is now closed again due to difficulties with the building owner. This closure is being aired in the courts but Gene is actively seeking quarters for this long time Houston Fun Club.

Ron Levine owner of a fine new club, The Palace Club on Berry Street, found himself burned out also. The all new Palace Club and Sky Terrace is the result of this fire.

These fires were all very costly, well into the Hundreds of Thousands. The Plantation Club, The Palace Club were ruled arson by the authorities. The Bullseye???? Mr. Parks of the Houston Fire Department Arson Squad said "the cause as yet has not been determined."

\$10,000.00 has been offered for the arrest and conviction of person or persons responsible for the fire destroying the Palace Club and The Plantation Clubs in Houston, Texas.

Ronnie Lavine, Palace Club and Sky Terrace has offered \$10,000.00.

Emet A. Newton, Jr., co-owner of the Plantation Club, has offered \$400.00.

This paper is well aware of the stories circulated unfounded in the Gay circules regarding these disastrous fires.

COURT ASKED TO DROP SODOMY CASE

A question of whether the State of Texas filed its appeal on time may give the U. S. Supreme Court an opportunity to sidestep the Buchanan case.

Private Club Battle Over

Private clubs battling the Alcoholic Beverage Commission's rule lost the final state round last week, but the ABC said the rule should not put hardships on any club.

Some club owners contend Rule and Regulation 56 will put 75 percent of the club owners out of business. But Administrator O. N. Humphreys, Jr. said the new rules are simple to obey and easy to understand.

The final effort of the clubs failed Wednesday when the Texas Supreme Court denied a rehearing in its previous decision upholding the ABC.

The Attic Club and the Black Garter Clubs of Dallas filed an appeal with the U.S. Supreme Court Friday but it was not immediately determined whether this would delay enforcement by the state.

Humphreys said the ABC will give the club operators to adjust to any changes required in their operations.

"We are extremely pleased that the court has agreed with our contention that Rule and Regulation No. 56 is needed to regulate private clubs," Humphreys said.

"In the language of the court," Hempreys said, "the rule requires no more than that private clubs determine the credentials of a guest and hence his right to enjoy club favors, by the simple test of whether he is personally known to and vouched for by a host-member.

"Likewise, the implementation of the statutory requirement that a private club 'shall provide regular food service adequate for its members and their guests,' in terms of 'complete meals available on the club premises', is in our opinion, sufficiently understandable to the operators of private clubs.

"All that Rule 56 requires is that private clubs conduct their affairs as contemplated by the enabling definition in Article 666-15(e); this means that club privileges and immunities are not to be available to strangers or those who happen by, and that a token or less than complete food service for the members and their guests will not suffice."

ADVOCATE FALSELY REPORTS SAN ANTONIO RAID

In the Aug. 10—Sept. 1 Advocate, a National Gay Newspaper the following appeared. "POLICE ACTIVE AGAIN IN SAN ANTONIO — Police activity against Gays has apparently resumed in San Antonio, after a lull of nearly two years, with a combined raid by city and military police on tommie's, a midtown bar.

The number of arrests was undetermined.

The raid recalled an anti-Gay campaign in the city a number of years ago.

Tommy's Bar was not raided and there were no arrests. There is no stimulated ''police harrassment'' of Gays and Gay Bars. San Antonio is clear and calm as of now.

Reports of this nature are apt to happen, it is unfortunate but reliable informants sometimes confuse issues when routine investigations occur.

OBEY THE LAW

On August 31st private clubs to undergo strict regulatory measures. The T.L.C.B. will in effect inforce the new club laws to the letter.

The law in laymans language is, so far as the members are concerned:

There will be no such thing as a guest card. If you are not a member of the club you wish to attend, join, go with a member or don't go! If you go with a member as his guest, you are that and must remain as simaise twins. The member is to pay the check, not the guest. You are to be in the company of the member while in the club.

If you are a club member you must pay your entrance fee for membership. In addition there will be a charge for the "liquor pool" in the club of which you are a member. This "liquor pool" charge is made monthly and must be reported to the state. Your not meeting this obligation jepordizes your standing as a member of said club.

The club operators have to meet certain rules in order to be open for your enjoyment. Doing your part without any problem makes your club owners job much easier, you do this for yourself, he does it for all of you.

GALVESTON-


On the prowel again — just a weekend but seemed months. Having no luck finding the bottom that goes with the top of my car which was borrowed some weeks back rented a new one.



Six A.M. found me at West Beach, four and one half miles from the end of the seawall, Galveston, Texas. My little blue car pulled in backwards, so the sea and the surf would not get my windshield dirty.

An ice cold Fabaucher would taste real good, even at this early hour, as I had been out barring around the night before. So I opened the trunk of my car, took out my ice chest and removed a cold can of beer. I went behind my car then, even thou the beach was all mine, and slipped out of my jeans and into my swimming suit. Yawning and stretching I took another sip of beer.

Taking from the ice chest a package of chicken necks, I split the plastic wrapper, and withdrew three. Have you ever seen a half thaughed chicken neck. ''GROOSE'' I then took three lengths of kite string, about ten feet long, and tied them to the chicken necks, or should I say the other way around. Three poles that had once been

The poles about fifteen feet apart, I threw the chicken necks to the undercurrent to play with, and to drag on the bottom.


Back at the car for another sip of beer, which by this time was beginning to get warm. About seven twenty, crab net in hand, back to the water I went to check the crab lines. The first line, nothing, the second line nothing, but yes, the third line had a female crab chewing on the bait. I spit in her face and tossed her back in, with "go home, tell your big brother to come back". He must have, for back on the second line I retreaved a nice blue claw. (Male) which I put in the toe sack, back to line two, one crab, back to the sack, back to line three, no crab, over to line two again, no crab. But back on line one, one more crab, which I took back to sac. Now the next hour it was back to lines, back to sac, back to lines, back to sack, and etc. At this point I was tired and thirsty, 'cause if you have ever tried to buck the waves and undercurrent, if your ninty pounder, it can ware you down, and anyway I had made a pretty good catch.

I would walk from each line and hawl them in, when I had three crabs in my net then I would go back to toe sack, and then go back to lines. I did this for about thirsty minutes, and had some more luck, bringing up one or two crabs off each line. By the time I was thirty again, I had about thirty nice crabs in the sack. They were really bitting good today.

About eleven O'clock I returned to the car, to find that other people were begining to arrive on the beach and I had some neighbors about fifty feet from my car, they eyeballed me, and I eyeballed them back. I waved, they







1/3 Cup oil -

1/2 Cup minced onions -

sophisticated dinner.

2 Eggs separated

1/3 cup cold water

1 teaspoon salt

1/8 teaspoon pepper

2 tablespoons chopped parsley

2/3 cups Matzo Meal

Boil in chicken soup and salted water. Heat oil in saucepan: cook onion until tender in hot oil. Remove from heat.

Beat together egg yolks, cold water, salt and pepper. Gradually beat in onions until completely blended. Stir in chopped parsley and Matzo Meal. Beat egg whites until stiff peaks form: gradually fold into Matzo Meal mixture. Cover and chill in refrigerator at least 1 hour.

Using 2 teaspoons, measure rounded teaspoons of Matza meal mixture, shape into balls and drop into boiling chicken soup or salted water. Cover and cook in boiling liquid for 25 to 30 minutes. Makes 18 to 20 balls.

KOSHER "HONEYED CHICKEN"

1 (4 lb. chicken) cut in serving pieces

1/2 lemon

2 teaspoons ground ginger

salt to taste

1/3 Cup oil (chicken fat is always best) if not on hand peanut oil is used in most Kosher dishes.

1/4 cup honey

Rub the chicken pieces w/lemon. Springle w/teaspoon ginger and salt. Combine oil, honey and 1 teaspoon ginger. Brush chicken w/honey mixture. Roast in oven 350f -1-1/2 to 2 hours basting occasionally w/the honey mixture. Makes 6 servings.




