JIM WYNN SHOT TO DEATH

GANG MEMBERS ARRESTED FOR MURDER AT SEX AND DOPE PARTY. A CONTRACT?

HOUSTON Five persons who said they were members of the notorious Bandidos motorcycle gang have been arrested for the murder of James C. Wynn, 30. Indictments have been returned against them in the case.

Don Chambers of Houston, national president of the Bandidos, said that he and the Pasadena Bandidos chief (Called "Alley Cat") talked the five, three men and two women into turning themselves into Houston police.

The five Bandidos are: Roy James Gibson, 23, from Tacoma, Washington; Jerry Jackson, 28, of Bellaire who identified himself as "a fulltime Bandido"; Larry Bruce King, 21, from Olympia, Washington; Mrs. Paula Ann Kelly, 28, and Miss Marty Ann James, 23, both of 1707 Waugh Drive in Houston. The Waugh Drive address was raided recently as a bawdy house operation. Jackson is also a fugitive from justice on an assault charge filed in Seattle, according to the FBI.

Wynn, an unemployed lounge operator, died at Ben Taub Hospital after he was shot in the head at about 4:00 a.m. September 13th 1971.

Wynn was formerly the manager of the old Plantation Club here before he opened his own club, The Apartment. He later closed this club and became a partner with Lannis Thompson in the Romulus Club, now defunct. He also managed the Romulus Club until his partner discovered serious discrepancies in the outstanding stock issued by the Romulus Club's corporation which suggested an attempt to embezzle. Mr. Thompson, an attorney, took legal actions to protect the corporation's interests from the scheme and Wynn left Houston suddenly for parts unknown. When no charges were filed against him in connection with the matter he later returned to town. Wynn was allegedly deeply involved in the illegal drug traffic here and was known as "THE HIGH PRIESTESS OF POT" to his friends and others. He had been employed briefly as a bartender at The Farm House club prior to his death. The Farm House is operated by the former owners of the old Plantation Club. He is survived by his widow, a young woman he married a few years ago.

The murder took place at 909 W. Main at a party organized at The Palace Club by Wynn and several others. According to some witnesses the Bandidos and their women

companions were present at the Palace Club and were invited to attend the party. The guests were numbered at about 20 and most were smoking marijuana and using other drugs. Also according to witnesses one of the women at the party was having sexual relations with one of the male guests when one of the Bandidos decided it was his turn to have her. He dragged the woman from one bedroom across the living room into another bedroom. At this, Wynn attempted to stop what appeared to be a rape. His attempts to interfere resulted in the Bandido knocking Wynn to the floor. When Wynn tried to get up, the Bandido pulled a .32 calibre pistol from beneath his shirt and fired at Wynn. Witnesses said the three Bandido women were screaming "Kill him! Kill him!" during the altercation. Other witnesses said that the Bandidos and their women then told the other guests that "this is a rip-off," demanding their wallets and other valuables. After killing Wynn the murderer and his companions fled the apartment.

One of the guests then gathered up hypodermic syringes and other narcotic paraphernalia, along with some of the drugs being used, placed them in the trunk of his car and left the party for a near-by service station. From there he telephoned Houston police and then returned to the scene of the murder. In the meantime, another of the guests gathered up the rest of the narcotics and marijuana and flushed them down the toilet in the apartment. The mass of drugs caused the toilet to stop up but just before the police arrived the drain unclogged. Several of the guests present at the time of the murder and robbery fled the scene before police arrived. Nine of the left Houston suddenly for parts unknown. When no charges were filed against him in connection with the matter he later returned to town.

Homosexual role questioned

DALLAS — The Rev. Spurgeon, Dunman III, editor of The Texas Methodist, reviewing recent disruptions by the Gay Liberation Front of the Southwest Texas Conference meeting in San Antonio, questions the effectiveness of a homosexual serving as minister to other homosexuals.

Writing in an issue of the denominational newspaper, he observed:

"We question whether a practicing homosexual can any more effectively provide a Christian ministry for other homosexuals than can a drinking alcoholic minister to other alcoholics."

The issue arose at San Antonio when Gene Leggett, a member of the Dallas Theater

Center and an ordained minister who admits to being a homosexual, sought to have his ministerial license extended. His plea was refused.

Remarking he feels that in the perspective of the gospel homosexuality is unnatural and not an acceptable form of human behavior, Dunnam adds, however, "we must be much more compassionate and tolerant" in re-stating the traditional church stance on the issue.

He explains that, while he does not advocate "a church law automatically forbidding homosexuals from the ordained ministry, the burden of proof of demonstrating the need for a different and yet scripturally sound position" should be placed on the shoulders of "the would-be homosexual minister."

A HUSTLERS VIEW FROM THE TOP

I have long been fascinated with the world of hustling. Part of this fascination comes from the inherent curiosity of an author. Another part derives from the fact that my educational background is in the field of advertising-marketing. In short, all of us come into this world with the necessary commodity — our bodies — but few of us are capable of marketing it successfully.

It is interesting to note that some people do make it big in this particular profession. The field has many opportunities for those people with the right looks, talents, brains and good luck. It can be noted that while I have met and talked with literally hundreds of hustlers, I have yet to meet a really successful one who did not have, to one degree or another, some combination of those four traits.

The rewards of hustling, as in any other profession, can be fantastic for those who make it to the top. I have met some of the really big-time young men who have climbed to heights of success that many people would find unbelievable in the extreme. They have penthouses, cars, spending money, clothes. They mingle with the aristocracy of Europe and the wealthy in America. Granted, these at the summit are few compared to the multitudes involved in this particular profession, but then in any business how many actually make it to Mahogany Row? It takes a special brand of individual to make it to the peak. Not everyone — even if they wanted to — could do it.

This article is another of my interviews with one of the lucky ones who did.

His name is Brad (pseudonym of course). I ran into him again recently at a straight party in one of the major European cities. He is attractive: green eyes, blond hair, good physique. He is well hung. He is an American. He saw me first and came over to talk over cocktails. After the party we went out to a local bar for more drinks and conversation.

I had first met Brad a few years previously. He had been one of a group of young boys an acquaintance of mine had just brought together to form a call-boy service. I could have told from the first meeting that Brad had potential. That he was

already ensconced in a suite at one of the more fashionable West-Coast addresses at sixteen was a good indication of the way he was going. Few people make it big cruising the streets. Like any other field of marketing, you need a selling force behind you. Choosing the right person, or group of people to represent you takes a bit of discernment. It is often hard to keep away from syndicate-operated establishments. While you can make it to the top there, too, most of the smart ones stay clear of those factions involved in organized crime.

BRAD: Meeting John was, of course, my first break. He knew what he was doing. I mean he really knew. But he wasn't an exploiter either. As green as I was when I started out in this business, anyone could have really taken advantage of me. I mean, I was that ignorant of what was coming off. At that age, I didn't know there was big money involved. I was just looking for some kind of job that would take me out of the house. My mother was dead and my father wanted a life unhindered by the existence of a sixteen-year-old son. John was the perfect out. I met him through a friend of mine in school. Timmy and I were on the gymnastics team together and had fooled around quite a bit sexually. He said he knew someone who was setting up another call-boy operation in the city and wanted to know if I would be interested. When I found out there was the possibility that I might get an apartment of my own as part of the deal, I jumped at the chance for a meeting.

REPORTER: What happened at the meeting?

BRAD: It was really funny. Of course, you know John and how he operates. I didn't. Not then anyway. I went prepared for sex. Jesus, was I surprised. All we did was sit and talk about other things besides hustling. He wanted to know about my father, my mother, my family situation. I could tell that Timmy had already filled him in on a lot of details. Then suddenly the interview was just over. He said he would contact me. I thought it was one of those don't-call-me-I'll-call-you lines.

REPORTER: Apparently it wasn't.

BRAD: Timmy told me the

next week that everything was set. John wanted to use me. We had to be careful though because I was underage. Instead of an apartment by myself, John moved Timmy and I in together. It made it easier to say that we were sharing expenses when anyone asked. I also told my dad that I had gotten a part-time job with a modeling agency. John fixed that up. There was an agency, but it was just a cover. John had a photographer snap all sorts of professional-like pictures of me. I kept them in a portfolio on the coffee table in case any straight dropped by. During the same photographic session the guy snapped some other pictures showing the other group of customers just what I had to offer. Oh, nothing dirty. As dirty as they got was having work up an erection for a series of photos. Again, no sex. John was there for all the sessions. It was all very business like. You know to this day I couldn't really tell you if John were queer or not. If he was, he was getting his sex from elsewhere than his employees.

REPORTER: You knew the other boys that worked for him?

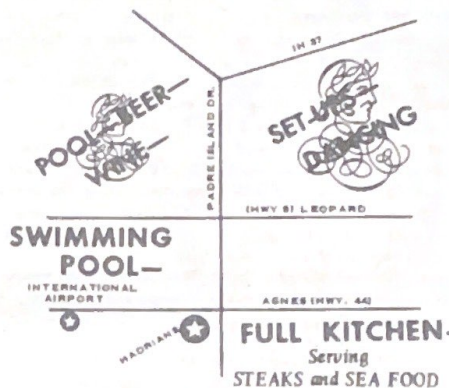
BRAD: Christ, yes. That was another thing about John that I liked. He kept everything above board. He also let his people socialize. We all met you at that one party. You know, a lot of organizations try to keep the kids apart. That way they don't get to talk over just how much of the take they are getting. John treated us all as equals. There was this one kid named Bob. You remember Bob, don't you? He was the one who looked kind of frail. He got paid more than the rest of us for a session, but he was into the S/M thing. John took the time to explain why he got more. He didn't have to. He was just a cool operator. I think everyone of us had a crush on him. We all liked him so much that even when we got together we didn't usually talk business. We all trusted John. I would trust him today in a second.

REPORTER: You weren't in on this S/M thing?

BRAD: No, not really. I did a few of the leather bits a couple of times. But no one got in beat me like they did Bob. It wasn't my bag. I remember Jo asked me once if I wanted to take the paddle. He said one customer had seen my

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pictures and was really turned on to me. John said if I let the guy paddle me, my share would be ten dollars for each whack. I said no. John didn't press me. John was like that. I mean if I was getting ten bucks per hit, I wonder what John would have cleared from it. I really liked the guy.

REPORTER: You're not with John any longer?

BRAD: John made it quite clear to all of us that we weren't going to be with him forever. He was selling our bodies, and when we were no longer in demand we would be gotten rid of. Of course he wasn't all that hard-nosed about it. It wasn't like we got used up over night. He gave us an average estimate of three years. He said maximum would be five. Most of his customers were regulars. They were those pillars of society who couldn't cruise the streets and didn't go to the bars. John had to give them variety to keep them happy. They got as tired of having sex with us as we did in having sex with them.

REPORTER: So how long did you stay with him?

BRAD: A little less than three years. I could have gone on for awhile longer, but I enrolled in college instead. John had regrets about letting me go -- anywhy he said he did -- but I think we both knew that my time was about up. We got together and had a long talk at the end. I got a lot of pointers from him. In a way, he has influenced the direction of my life more than my father ever could have. Did you know that John used to be a hustler? He used to be married to this studio head in Hollywood. But then, sure you knew. You and John are friends. You're lucky being his friend. It is really impossible to be friends and business associates. Anyway I think it is for John.

REPORTER: So, how did you get from there to here?

BRAD: Well, by the time I had left John, I was a little smarter than when I started. I also knew that there was money in selling my body. I had only worked for a little less than three years on a part-time basis, and I had enough money saved for four years of college. Oh, not Harvard or any of the big universities but enough for college anyway. I've got to thank John for that, too. He had a standard operating procedure of making us bank part of our money. He said it was only good business. He didn't

want his kids leaving him and bitching about the raw deal they had gotten. And he knew enough about hustling to know that there was nothing worse than working your ass off and coming away with nothing to show for it. John's having been a hustler really helped us. It wasn't bad at all saying good-bye when you had a little nest egg to carry you over. There were no hard feelings if you know what I mean.

REPORTER: So what are you doing now?

BRAD: Still hustling.

REPORTER: At that party?

BRAD: No. The party was just for fun. It was friends and all. There is more to life than just the Gay existence. You know that. I think I learned that from John and from college. Everyone who wants to be a successful hustler should go to college. How is that for an advertisement for higher education? But it's true. College gives one a certain poise. Some guys think you don't need a brain to hustle. They are used to these one-night stands

on the streets. You know the old line about people not having a brain? Well for the one-night stand that might well be right. But if you're going to hustle seriously, it is not the ---and-run encounters that are the most lucrative. And if you don't have the ability to carry on a conversation, you're not going to have potential as a sought-after item. Some guys I've met recently have been more interested in conversation than sex. Some of them can't even get it up anymore. They just want you to make them feel young. There's a lot of ways of doing that without crawling into bed with them. College teaches you how. Oh, granted, they don't have a course on the subject, but you learn how to fit in with those who have money or who are going to have it. You make contacts there, too. You know the old saying about it's not who you know but who you blow? Well, I've discovered that it's who you know and who you blow that really counts.

REPORTER: You made contacts in college?

BRAD: A lot of them. After all, there are homosexuals who go to college. But it's another life from the one on the streets. It's a good deal more sophisticated. It's more than just sex. I met this exchange student from France. We had this thing for almost a year. After college I came over here to visit him and his

family. We had passed the point of having sex with each other, but we were still good friends. That's what is different about meeting a guy who is Gay in college instead of in the bars. In the bars you've got nothing in common except a desire for a night of sex. But in college you've got classes together, sports events, the whole atmosphere. You're part of a bigger family. It's easier to have sex with someone and still be friends afterwards.

REPORTER: So that's what you're doing in Europe?

BRAD: That was over a year ago. His family knew people. So did he. I got together with this president of an automobile factory. He was married and had three kids, but he liked me. We were together for almost a whole year. He was very generous. He knew people. I was at the party this evening because Karl had introduced me to the host and hostess.

REPORTER: And now?

BRAD: Well, it's over with Karl. He has taken a fancy to this butch blond Austrian. But that's okay. We parted friends, and we had fun while it lasted. I also have quite a few investments going now. People like Karl know that it is easier to make the break when you leave your companion with a little something to work with. Karl invested money for me. I have no complaints. I have enough money to bum around Europe for a couple years just on the interest I'm getting. I'll probably try to find a couple more people to have fun with before I go home. There's this one Italian actor that wants me to go to the Greek islands with him. He's going on location there for a picture next month. I'll probably go. Of course, I'm not silly enough to believe that I can go on like this indefinitely. I'm getting old. But when you're selling your body, your prime time is short. You can stretch it longer though, I've found, if you have an education. There aren't too many young kids off the streets who have the finesse to be a companion to a lot of the guys who have money. As I said, there are people who want more for what they pay than just sex.

Homosexual marriage ruled illegal

MINNEAPOLIS - The Methodist minister who performed the marriage ceremony for two avowed homosexuals acted illegally, according to the Minnesota area bishop of the United Methodist Church.

Bishop Paul Washburn said that, although the Rev. Roger Lynn is an appointed "street minister," and thereby authorized to perform marriages, the act was illegal. Jack Baker, the president of the University of Minnesota Student Association, and his roommate, James McConnell, both 29, went through a private marriage ceremony last Friday.

Blue Earth County Atty. John Corbey said he wrote letters to both men on Aug. 31 telling them their marriage licence was invalid because the "address listed on the application was not that of the bride" and the law uses the word "woman" in referring to one of the applicants.

"It is evident that Mr. Lynn read this marriage service illegally," Bishop Washburn said, "because the marriage license was invalid."

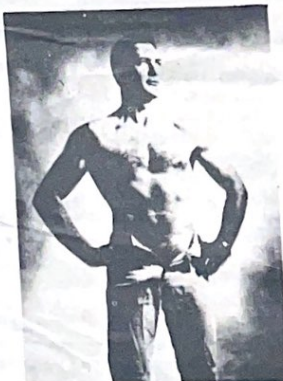

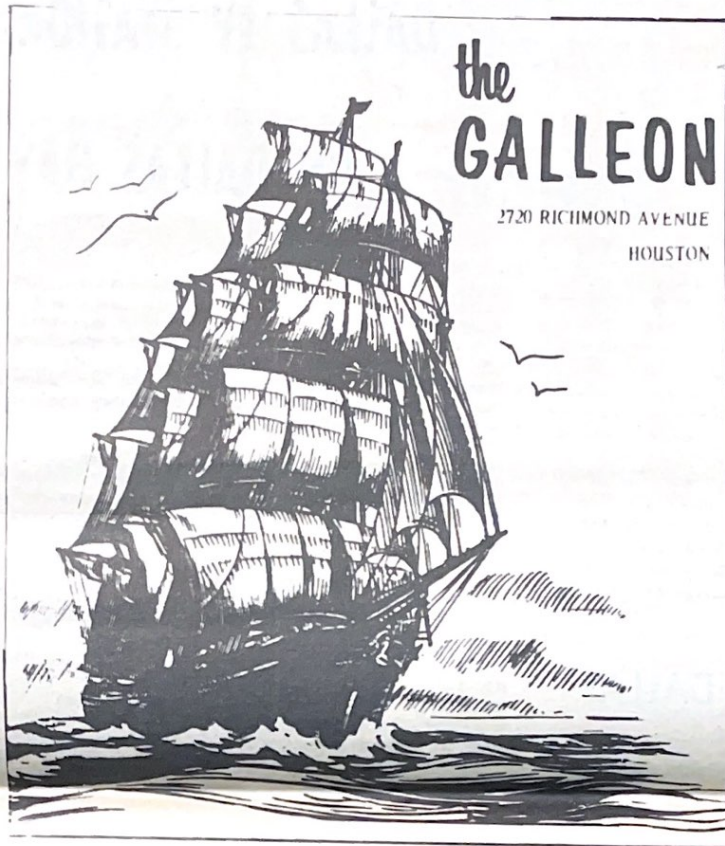

DALLAS TV STATION AIRS DOCUMENTRY ON DALLAS GAY COMMUNITY

On Wednesday, September 8th at 6:30 p.m. and again at 10:00 p.m. television viewers of Channel 13 in Dallas saw a remarkable documentary news film on Gay life in the Dallas area. It was prepared by Channel 13 (KERA) filmmakers Donna Yarbrough, Sam Newbury and reporter Greg Roberson.

The Channel 13 staffers spent almost five months working on the film in association with a number of Dallas Gay Community representatives.

Leaders of the Gay Community of Dallas had spent considerable time working with the TV people in the preparation of this important documentary and they were alerted several days prior to its broadcasting.

These Gay Community leaders then went to work telephoning members of large Dallas homophile population to urge them to watch Channel 13's presentation of the film.

One of the contributors to the film, Dennis Sisk, owner of the Julius Caesar's Lodge, spoke on local Gay life and there are several bars and clubs in the Dallas area featuring such performances. As part of the interview about these shows, Dennis came as a surprise to the

"straight" Dallasites to learn of such human diversity and strivings. Apparently many hets interviewed as a rule consigned their fellow-citizens of Gay persuasion generally to the currently fashionable "sick" category promoted by US psychiatrists and "liberal" journalists. However, many hets interviewed made such genuinely liberal statements, as, "...Just because a person is different doesn't necessarily mean he's sick."

One person even made the statement, "If they are sick, then we are all sick."

The Rev. Richard Vincent was filmed while conducting religious services of the Metropolitan Community Church of Dallas, a predominantly Gay church organization. He later told reporter Greg Roberson that a person could be Gay and accepted by God, too.

"The Lord is my Shephard and He knows I'm Gay!" An interesting part of the filmed documentary was a scene from a "drag" show at the Club Maars. Mr. Roberson had said that he wanted to show the various facets of Dallas's Gay life and there are several bars and clubs in the Dallas area featuring such performances. Because they are here, you know." just as "married" as any so-called (Thanks a lot, fella!) straight couple, and just as loyal. One particularly ridiculous item

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was an interview with one, Bill Frazier, head of the Dallas PD squad. This worthy explained how police officers are sent into local public restrooms to stand about with their private parts exposed to "await propositions" from local Gays. In light of the FBI statistics on skyrocketing crime rates in Dallas it would seem that a better use of the tax money of Dallasites could be found.

The usual trodolytic opinions of homosexuality were included in the responses of local non-Gay folk: "Homosexuality is evil! The Bible says so, and it is a sin to use television to try to justify it." But then Dallas is also smack in the middle of the Bible-banging Belt of Texas and God knows any preposterous atrocity can be given Scriptural justification by the fanatically devout religionist.

On the other hand, some comments were more indicative of the advanced thinking of a great many Dallasites: "Congratulations! We need to see more controversial subjects on TV."

One person hedged with: "It's all right to show this at 10:00 p.m. but it should not have been shown at 6:30!" However, the station had announced at the beginning of the program that although nothing pornographic (sic!) was present in the documentary, because of its contents some parents might prefer their children not see it.

Another citizen made the comment: "It's one thing for consenting adults in private, but what about when they molest your seventeen year-old son?" Mr. Roberson explained that

homosexuality and child molestation are not the same thing. He might have added that the overwhelming cases of child molestation involve practising heterosexual males who attack both boys and girls. This is a genuinely psychiatric problem, however, and not a matter of sexual orientation.

From the professional community the documentary selected Dr. Jerry Lewis of the department of research development at Timberlawn Hospital in Dallas who said that homosexuality has existed always in every culture, even the most primitive ones and that it exists universally to-day. He stated that there are probably more homosexually-oriented human beings than most people suspect. He conservatively estimated that 3 to 4 per cent of the adult male population of the USA is predominantly Gay, but that homosexuality is not as prevalent among females. (This is moot, for it is not nearly as difficult for a female homosexual to live in the present cultural environment of the USA as for a homosexual male. There is also less necessity for females to acknowledge their homosexuality in order to function more satisfactorily as human beings.) Dr. Lewis also commented that most of his fellow psychiatrists believe that all homosexuals are "sick," but that they in fact see only "a small slice of the pie." Those men and women who are well-adjusted and happy in their lives have little reason to see a psychiatrist. (Surprise! Surprise!)

At the end of the show a local drag artist, Tina, brought the production to a somewhat dramatic and misleading

conclusion with an emotional performance of "I've Got To Be Me." Unfortunately, this gave the impression that all Gays were, deep down in their hearts, just dying to dress up in mom's latest frock and step out in public. No day, Babel! As a result of the program, the station received more than 300 telephone calls, 20% of which were favorable, 10% unfavorable and another 10% expressing no opinion but wanting more information.

It was, of course, a giant step forward in the struggle for Gay rights as decent citizens, and the staff at Channel 13 in Dallas are to be commended for their worthwhile effort. Perhaps we could see this same documentary locally? It would, overall, help.

ANOTHER HET MARRIAGE BOMB! EDITOR INDICATED FOR WIFE'S MURDER!

Galveston. A grand jury indicated Thomas G. Steph, 48, of 28 South Shore Drive, on a charge of murder with malice on September 28th in connection with the August 2nd drowning death of his socially prominent wife, Patricia.

Also, after a hearing on the 27th in Galveston, Probate Judge Jerome Jones took under advisement a challenge to an application by Steph to serve as executor of his late wife's estate.

The challenge was filed by James Harris Scott, the late Mrs. Steph's brother, and her attorney, Curt F. Steib, Esq. Mr. Scott is guardian of Mrs. Steph's two minor children and along with Mr. Steib is an executor of

Mrs. Steph's estate according to a will which predated Mrs. Steph's marriage to Steph.

Steph remains under a \$50,000 bond set on August 4th after murder charges had been filed against him by Galveston police. Steph came to Galveston in August 1963, to become managing editor of the Galveston Daily News.

HOUSTON PD OFFICERSE ALLEGED HETEROSEXUALS POST BOND!

Suspended Houston Police Officers Jack A. McMahon and Arthur N. Hill posted \$10,000 bonds each recently on federal charges that they violated the civil rights of two police prisoners last April.

Hill and McMahon were arraigned before U. S. District Judge Woodrow Seals.

The US Government alleged the two heterosexuals violated the civil rights of Bobby Joe Conner and Larry Taylor by inflicting summary punishment upon them. Since Conner died, conviction could carry a term up to life imprisonment.

The two officers were previously acquitted of murder charges in a State Court trial in New Braunfels last June.

HETEROSEXUAL HUSBAND MURDERS WIFE AT HOME!

DALLAS. The husband of Mrs. Helene Caskie Bothwell, Dallas "Ad Woman of the Year", was arrested for the murder of Mrs. Bothwell after he shot her in their Dallas home.

Mrs. Bothwell, 35, mother of four, died of 5 gunshot wounds fired from an automatic pistol. Her husband, John G. Bothwell, 44, had to be overpowered at the scene, according to Dallas police officers, when they attempted to handcuff him. Police said Mrs. Bothwell had started divorce proceedings.

NOTORIOUS HETEROSEXUAL PORNO FLICK JOINTS HIT BY POLICE!

HOUSTON. Houston Vice Squad officers recently arrested three men in the first raid of a new crackdown on pornographic movies in the city.

Two men, allegedly heterosexual, were arrested at the North Houston Theatre, 8718 Jensen Drive. Another man, also allegedly het, was arrested

at the Climax Lounge on Westheimer. Officers said they had warrants for the arrest of two of the men and the third man was arrested for committing an alleged offence when police arrived.

John Law's foray into the obscene movie world turned into a bad scene Tuesday.

The Climax Lounge, 534 Westheimer, was padlocked when vice Sgt. G. S. McMenemy, three of his officers and Greg Laughlin, an assistant district attorney, arrived.

At the North Houston Art Theater, 8716 Jensen Drive, the officers found a few male patrons enjoying a flick, but it was not the one they wanted at this location.

The searchers were looking for a film called "Oh, Miss Bodie." Theater manager, Charles Swearington said "Miss Bodie" had been gone and he couldn't say just how long, maybe as long as three weeks.

After a chat with Swearington and his projectionist, E. L. Ford, the lawmen decided to call it a day — a bad day in fact.

Why were they looking for these two flicks? Justice of the Peace Hugo Touchy says they are obscene and contain some sexual intercourse scenes.

He conducted a hearing to make this determination under a new statute, which requires such a procedure before a judge can issue search warrants authorizing seizure films or books.

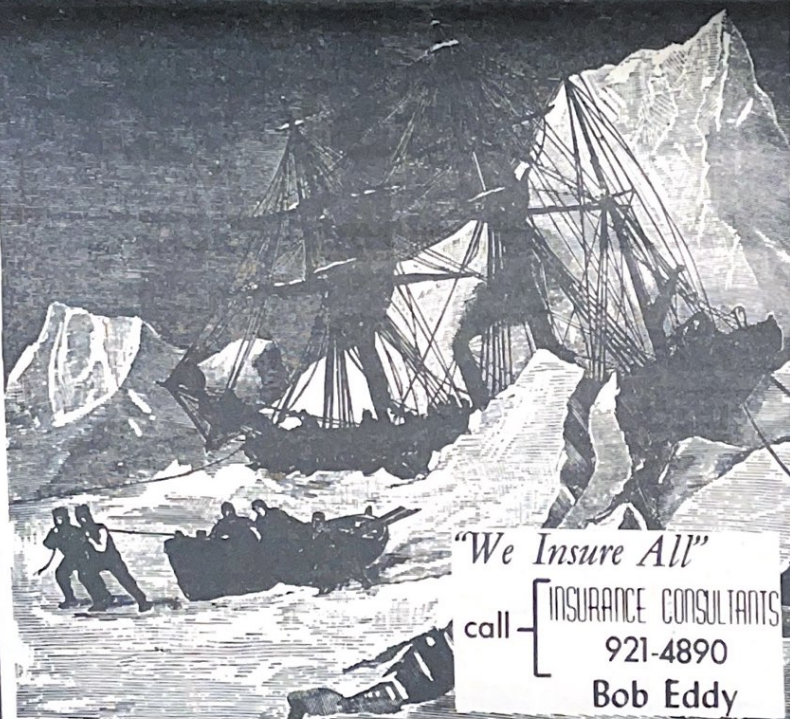

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GAY LIB TO "ZAP" CANDIDATES

"Confrontation politics" is the thrust of the Political Actions Committee. Discussion and planning of "ZAPS" are underway. Plans call for confronting candidates for the upcoming November elections and questioning them about their stand on the sodomy laws, harassment of gays, etc. In just a few weeks, when all candidates have declared, the Zapping will begin. Their responses to these questions, whether favorable or unfavorable, will be given the widest possible publicity. In addition a letter is being prepared to the candidates questioning their stand of the gay civil rights issue. Copies will be circulated so that gays and persons supporting gay civil rights may use it as a guideline to write the candidates.

ANTI-WAR REGIONAL CONFERENCE

On Sunday September 26 there was a regional anti-war conference at the University of Houston. About 200 delegates representing Texas, Oklahoma and Louisiana were there. The purpose was to coordinate plans in the region for the upcoming anti-war demonstration in Houston on Saturday November 6. Activists emphasized that this would be a legal, peaceful demonstration.

Representatives of several Gay Liberation groups were there including Houston Gay Liberation. The following resolution was submitted by the gays and overwhelmingly approved by the delegates:

The Texas Oklahoma Louisiana Peace Action Coalition (TOL PAC) commits itself to offering full support to the Gay Liberation movement. At the last National Student Mobilization Committee Conference, approximately a year and a half ago, SMC voted to "support the long-overdue struggle for freedom for its anti-war activists on all trips. For the homosexual sisters and brothers". Since that time, the Gay Liberation groups are now in all sections of America and in a number of other countries.

This dynamic new movement represents a valid political response to real oppression and a healthy breakthrough against repressive and irrational sexual attitudes and behavior. We gay men and women will no longer submit to our oppression. We are angry. We are proud. And we are demanding self-determination and endorsed by TOL PAC.

our full human rights. As Gay Liberation, the GI movement, the high school movement and the anti-war movement. Gay Liberation cuts across all forms of oppressive role playing, cuts through all layers of society, and gives a new impetus to the other liberation struggles.

The TOL PAC condemns the news media for refusing to recognize the participation of gay persons and the gay movement in the anti-war movement or at best distorting our participation. An example of this is the refusal of the TV cameraman this morning to film the "Gay People Against the War" banner even though he filmed all the other banners.

Participation of gay contingents has already substantially increased anti-war demonstrations. However, the full potential of this movement, involving tens of thousands of people and potentially millions in motion, has yet to be tapped by the anti-war movement.

We believe that the following concrete proposals will constitute real support for the gay liberation movement and by maximizing participation, help to end the war in Southeast Asia NOW.

1. All speakers for all rallies, meetings etc. must be made fully aware that Gay Liberation is supported by the anti-war movement, and that anti-gay remarks will not be permitted.

2. Gay Liberation speakers must be included on an equal basis with other segments of the anti-war movement.

3. TOL PAC should make an effort to include gay groups in the anti-war participation in the anti-war movement, and encourage gay contingents in the anti-war demonstrations.

4. The Gay Task Force and other gay groups and individuals must be defended against political attack.

5. The struggle of gay people against repressive laws and other forms of social oppression is part of the broader struggle for democratic rights which the anti-war movement must wage to protect its own right to Hygiene, The Phallus, and Exercise.

6. TOL PAC should distribute pamphlets, leaflets, buttons and posters relating gay people and the gay movement to the war activities.

7. A permanent gay task force is to be established within TOL PAC.

8. On all regional organizing trips, gay literature will be taken and displayed at literature tables and an etc."

9. Gay anti-war activists will establish the Gay Task Force office through ideas contained within the groups are now in all sections of America and in a number of other countries.

The editors of QQ MAGAZINE have put together an extraordinary health guidebook for the male homosexual.

This small book is more than a good guide to body cares and hygiene standards for men. The HOMOSEXUAL HEALTH GUIDEBOOK provides a source for recognition or detection of those diseases which may confront the homosexual.

It does not take the place of good communication between the man and his doctor. It does not describe treatment or disease.

The presentation is simple and specific questions of a homosexual are asked and direct answers are given. The book is designed to permit the homosexual male enough insight into his personal condition that he may seek competent medical attention without embarrassment or fear.

This guidebook is many years too late in its publication. We as the Gay community have needed this direct approach to our medical problems for a long time.

Gay Guys new to the scene will find this guidebook valuable for its many subjects: "Masturbation, Oral Sex, Anal Intercourse, Sexual Attitudes, Anal Associated Diseases, Venereal Disease, Drugs, Aphrodisiacs, Hygiene, The Phallus, and Exercise."

Each of these subjects require explanation yet the editors of QQ have condensed the information so thoroughly and with so much detail so that the small volume must become a standard bedside volume for each Gay Guy.

For the uninitiated, definitions are given for common terms--"69ing, rimming, fallation, cum, etc."

For the initiated, and or the questioning, the group of questions directed to "Sexual Attitudes" follows.

The book regarding--abnormality--straights vs gays--rough sex-- closet cases, etc.

QQ MAGAZINE

QQMAGAZINE is a magazine for "Gay Guys Gay No Hangups."

Quite by chance we found a copy of QQ in a book store in Tulsa—somehow it had fallen behind a stack of "Fortune".

This was good fortune for us. We believe this bimonthly publication to be the most colorful and direct homosexual publication for the male homosexual on the gay scene today.

The art work, the photography, the type styles, the literature, the advertisements are all combined with imagination and for the interest of the homosexual male.

The tons of paper that are currently presented to the homosexual for the most part seem to seek the \$ from the homosexual and in turn offer little that would serve his real needs.

QQ, however, does serve the Gay Guy by offering both pictures and literature of direct interest and with superb quality.

In the October issue the editorial speaks firmly and distinctly to the wordlessly, soundlessly, hypnotically-Gay Guy who may be perplexed in his current status—either as an individual gay in a "straight" society or as a gay seeking companionship in a "gay" society.

The editorial is labelled "Color Me Gay". The essence of the editorial seems direct enough when the editors say "We can only hope that

by joining together—if only in spirit we will form a strong community that will endure oppression and gradually become an integral part of society."

After reading this first (for us) issue, we contacted the publisher and were given permission to quote and review.

We spoke with Mr. Georges Desantis for QQ MAGAZINE and for the HOMOSEXUAL HEALTH GUIDEBOOK on behalf of our Midwest readers.

Walter Norris in "A New A New Homosexuality for Our Time" compares the hunger for sex as equal to the hunger for food or the thirst for drink.

Mr. Norris describes and paints a word portrait of each of several gay type males—we choose his description of the "Sphinx Lynx" to share with you—"You're alone at a urinal. Suddenly the door opens, he enters and glides across to the adjacent one. In almost less time than it takes to relate he has gazed, grooved, groped, zapped, zenithed, zippered and zombied out—all

wordlessly, soundlessly, hypnotically—as in some kind of trance—like current status—either as an individual gay in a "straight" society or as a gay seeking companionship in a "gay" society.

Terry McWaters asks "Lurid lust or lasting love—how can you tell which is which?" In his searching for infatuation or extended love moments, the Gay Guy experiences the all types of men and Mr. McWaters offers solace and advice for success

in your choice between the two alternatives.

Jay Hagen's "Coming-Out Ball" is an interesting piece of fiction with piquant moments for a virgin finding his way into the gay life.

Ralph W. Davis and John Roberts have each prepared a guide to cruising grounds. Mr. Davis outlines the Washington, D. C., action while Mr. Roberts goes afield to give you a guide to California's parks, including Griffith Park in L.A.

Mr. David Parker with photos by Gable lend words and a picture portrayal to "Boozin' Cruisin' Boston". Throughout the magazine the editors use excellent photographs and drawings.

A Jay drew his colorful version of "Mickey Muscle" for the October front cover—a good companion for JOC's "Slave Drawing" for the back cover.

There are many other articles of interest in this one issue and we hasten to add: our omission is not an indication of non-relevance or of lesser quality—just space requirements.

To Mr. George Desantis, publisher of QQ and his excellent staff, we ask your advise on this problem:

After his "comingout" party, the average guy hesitates in informing his family and "straight" friends of his new-found interests. We have been asked for a reference or guidebook that could be useful as an aid in informing those who are dear to us. We hope your extensive interests could lead us to such a publication already existent.

Or, is perhaps your staff's HOMOSEXUAL HEALTH GUIDEBOOK

a really outstanding first of its kind, part of a long-range program that offers the Gay Guy more and more direct services that would include a "Guidebook" such as we are seeking.

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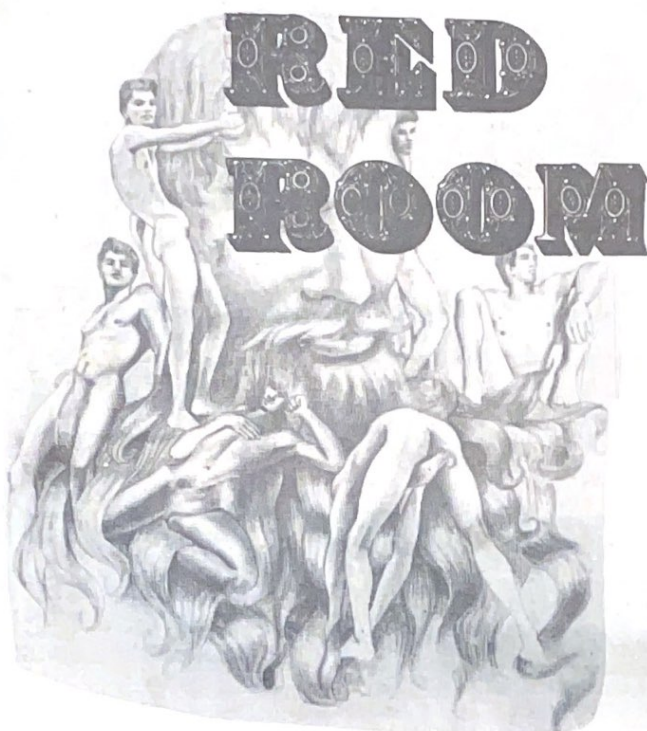

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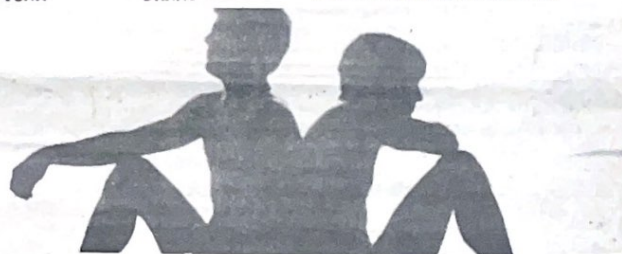

The Man Who

"Cures" Homosexuals

(The following articles are reprinted by permission from VECTOR, the excellent slick-paper magazine published by S.I.R., the Society for Individual Rights. S.I.R. is the largest active organization in the USA dedicated to freedom for gays—freedom from guilt, harassment and social injustice. The author of the first article, Dr. Lawrence J. Hatterer, is teaching at Cornell University and is the author of the book, *Changing Homosexuality in the Male*. This article originally appeared in *Sexual Behaviour* magazine. Unfortunately, Dr. Hatterer's viewpoint is shared by a number of influential psychiatrists. This the sort of regressive theorizing which aided the Nebraska psychiatrists in lobbying through a law in that State under which homosexuals can be thrown into state mental hospitals just for being gay! This man and his ilk can hardly be ignored. Ed.)

Upwards of thirty million men in our country have engaged in homosexual acts, often just as a transient interest in adolescence. This type of sexual experimentation is very different from those people who have chosen to live within one or several of the homosexual subcultures... Homosexuality results from inhibitions, disturbed patterns of gender identity, inadequate capacities to relate to women, and other factors which are amenable to treatment.

I have "cured" many homosexuals. Any researcher may examine my work because it is all documented on 10 years of tape recordings. Many of these changed patients have married, had families and live happy lives. It is a destructive myth that "once a homosexual, always a homosexual." It has made and will make millions more committed homosexuals. What is more, not only have I but many other reputable psychiatrists (Dr. Samuel B. Hadden, Dr. Lionel Ovesey, Dr.

Charles Socarides, Dr. Harold Lief, Dr. Bieber, and others) have reported their successful treatments of the treatable homosexual.

I have treated numerous young men who were supposedly disturbed by their "homosexuality." But I do not look upon homosexuality as an entity. Rather it is a common symptom which appears in many individuals in response to innumerable, dissimilar situations.

There have been many cases where the problem was presented as being homosexuality, but my perspective casts it into a wholly different arena and dealt with a constellation of other problems which incidentally resulted in homosexual acting-out. When these problems were dealt with, they turned away from homosexuality.

I would say, in addition, that society's proscriptions make it very difficult to be homosexual without a lot of problems. It is not in accordance with what one has been taught from the very earliest age is appropriate, which means there necessarily is internal conflict. And it puts one in conflict with society's values.

What's more, I do not believe that the structure of our society, which is heterosexual, monogamous, and family oriented, is going to change to the extent that this entire fabric will go under—and that's what would have to happen in order to institutionalize or accept homosexuality. Until that happens, the homosexual will be a disturbed individual.

The judgment of impaired functioning is not quite so arbitrary. Perhaps it is considered gauche in this era of liberal social values to allude to the adage, "anatomy is destiny," but the fact is that we are what we are—a complex constellation of genetic mechanisms, endocrine systems, and nervous systems which differ between individuals in accordance with their reproductive physiology. Sexual relations with a person of the same sex represent a deviation or a short-circuiting of a very definite biological intention....

I've had young men come in and report homosexual orientation that was largely a matter of conditioning or learning. They may have been seduced by an older homosexual man when they were 16, and they developed a genuine romantic responsiveness to another male. This may be a rather total, prideful experience for a while—but only for a while.

I stress those feelings which already exist in the patient which may enhance his motivation to change. Rather than unhealthy repression, these efforts represent attempts at self-repair. In terms of utilizing religious proscriptions, I emphasize religious beliefs which stress ethics and family, rather than beliefs that are

punitive and guilt-oriented. I see it as a reinforcing, socializing force for that human being who needs external supports.

In sum, these people want to change. They want desperately to occupy a respected place in our society; they want to have a wife; they want to have a child, to have the kind of family they had before or never had and wish to make. They simply cannot reconcile their homosexuality with these more treasured aims, and hence seek help to renounce the homosexuality. They pay a price, but it is their price and most feel it is worth it.

To be simplistic about it, if a person has been blocked in his heterosexual capacities, he is incapable of the same pleasures in sexual-love relationships as a heterosexual. This is true in our society. Now it might not be true on a deserted island where there are only men. In our society, with rare exceptions, a man is homosexual by default. He may consider himself to be deficient as a male, or be troubled in a great variety of ways. In our society such a man cannot as easily experience the same interpersonal rewards as a heterosexual person. Some do achieve satisfactory interpersonal lives and productive work-life styles against many odds.

Obviously, millions of men practicing homosexuality are productive at work and would report some periods of sexual happiness with their partners either in or out of sustained relationships. However, we must know more and look below the surface before we can say that everything is okay.

Before long he tends to view it as a denigrating experience. For one thing, doubts are introduced as well as shame when other boys call him fag or queer. He becomes an outcast. Perhaps he can withstand this impact for a while, until he realizes that he cannot utilize his idealized notions of homosexual love anywhere.

As he dips into the homosexual subculture—gay bars, homosexual streets, groups of homosexual acquaintances—he finds himself surrounded by sex addicts. Men are driven in their quest for homosexual acts, without any interest whatsoever in the actual person they make sex contact with. They are people who have failed to find something meaningful in themselves or in their lives, and pursue one sex act after another trying to make up for the deficit. And after the tenth sex act in a night they are as empty inside as when they started. This is demoralizing, and corruptive of a man's ability to function in his own best interest if he incorporates the neurotic strivings of this subculture. And it is very hard not to get caught up in this compulsive sexuality,

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where sex has nothing to do with either affection or fun.

I could go on for hours discussing the depression, suicidal feelings, grave feelings of inadequacy, pathetic passivity, and all sorts of neuroses manifested in the homosexual individuals who come to see me and this involves over 700 whom I have evaluated in depth. To a man, this entire population reported that they would choose to be other than homosexual if it were their choice to make.

And, to deal with an important issue which you suggested, and which is a chief complaint of homosexual organizations, the fact is that we treat individuals who are troubled by their homosexuality, who come to us voluntarily seeking help. It is true that the majority of my patients did not seek therapy with the aim of converting to heterosexuality. They did not see it as their choice to make.

The homosexuals that I have seen were in the main disgusted with the brevity of their relationships, disgusted by how they squandered their time, interfered with their work, dispensed with their integrity, and sacrificed hopes of an enduring relationship and family life by their driven pursuit of homosexual sex partners.

I have seen men who lived together for periods of five or seven years, but rarely twenty. And those who do stay together generally allow each other a lot of freedom sexually, or they will both invite a third party in for sex relations. The sexual involvement declines or disappears.

In reference to married men who have sporadic male homosexual contacts, one would have to investigate what was happening with these men and their wives at home. Such men want to be "served" by males or submit to them. But why? What and who drives them to such practices? There may be hundreds of reasons. Maybe they feel they have been so castrated and so feminized in their dealings with the world that they present their backsides to other males - as male animals do as a sign of submission to a more dominant male - or because they've been castrated by their wives. They see themselves in a completely humiliated situation, and wish to be sadistically used by another. This is one of the hundreds of reasons they may go just for an easy, quick masturbatory release of tension. Each person's use of a homosexual outlet must be examined for its worth and true satisfaction, its provocation of conflict or its valuelessness as an outlet.

Our society defines this as abnormal, every man knows this, and therefore, overwhelmingly, men who would engage in such acts do so to confirm a personal sense of unworthiness or degradation. Defining it as such makes it such! Do not impose metaphysical values on humans who do not know or care about ultimate truths - they are guided, ruled, if you will, by social judgments, irrational though they may be, which are a reality and structure reality for individuals in our culture.

Humanizing our heterosexual society

on presumed already agreed-upon sexual values and more is difficult enough. To think we'll do this for what in every contemporary society has been at best tolerated as "deviant behavior" is a pipe dream. We can't even get homosexuals deemed as "uncriminal" in 48 states in 1971. The laws remain 18th-century laws. How are we going to institutionalize the chaos and anarchy of homosexuality as it exists in America today?

Such men do come to my office and testify how degraded they feel by impersonal sex through a knothole in a subway latrine. They do have very damaged images of themselves, which are both a cause and a result of such behavior.

The big question regarding therapy is

what does the person want to do, not only with his sex life but with his life in general. A person's sex life has to be integrated into a total life style. As I said, the majority of the people I saw did not say they wanted to change to heterosexuality. They wanted help with their many problems of living as homosexuals in our society. But when they did want to change, I helped them to, and in many, many cases we succeeded.

An Analysis



(This is the reply to Dr. Hatterer's article, above. It also appeared in VECTOR, and was written by Mr. Martin Stow, a practicing psychologist in private practice in San Francisco. Mr. Stow also serves on the Board of Directors of S.I.R. Ed.)

Dr. Lawrence Hatterer's article on curing homosexuals has a certain hysterical organization which makes comment difficult, but not impossible. Running throughout is the theme that persons engaging in homosexuality may, by a therapeutic process, be reoriented toward heterosexual object relationships. The author states that many who might seek such reorientation do not. This is quite well recognized within the field of counseling and therapy and is quite correct. However, such a proposition needs to be put in the proper perspective.

There are four classes of persons seeking assistance relating to their homosexuality: (1) those who state that they

want to change, but who really do not want to reorient; (2) those who state that they want to change, and who really want to change; (3) those who state that they do not want to change, but who really want to change; and (4) those who state

that they do not want to change, and really do not want to change. No one knows the prevalence of each who comes for assistance but it is the responsibility of the person from whom assistance is sought to determine to which class the individual belongs, otherwise assistance is impossible. The idea that all four classes are amenable to sexual reorientation treatment is a therapeutic fantasy. Psychiatric practice allows a sexual physical conversion operation for transsexuals who believe that they possess the personality of a woman in the body of a man, or vice versa, so strong is the conditioned mind. The individual whose identity is psychodynamically involved in homosexuality will remain so oriented.

Dr. Hatterer's theoretic orientation is more sociological than psychological. His position is that sexual relations have a "very definite biological intention," a most conservative social concept that sex is only permissible for procreation. Yet, later he contradicts himself by accusing homosexuals of compulsive sexuality which has nothing to do with either "affection or fun." Hatterer also believes the structure of our society to be "heterosexual, monogamous and family oriented." From one side this assumption may be attacked by the well established tradition in Western Civilization of monastic and celibate communities. The largest and most powerful religion in our civilization is evidence. From the other side this position is vulnerable in view of the rapidly changing life-styles of the family unit. Serial monogamy occurs with such rapidity as to almost constitute polygamy; the family has become so

small and so influenced by external social factors as to question its status as an independent unit. Most important is the new concept of homosexuality in this heterosexual social structure. Sociologists confirm that younger people are not so "up-tight" about expressing homosexuality overtly; increasingly, homosexuality and heterosexuality are expressed alternately without individual disfunctioning in either object relationship. Young people are rejecting the traditional concept of an either-or sexuality. They have come to recognize what Dr. Hatterer and his colleagues have not; homosexuality has a positive functional purpose in the life of man, if it is not confined to or viewed solely as some neurotic, compulsive symptom.

Dr. Hatterer, as well as many homosexuals, apply heterosexuality criteria for successful relationships to homosexuality, principally the criteria of longevity, sexuality and fidelity. Homosexual relationships are usually not for extended periods, infidelity occurs frequently and, if the relationship does continue over an extended period, sexuality usually declines and disappears. This is the nature of the homosexual relationship. What Dr. Hatterer and his colleagues are going to have to learn is to view the homosexual relationship more as an educational process than a matrimonial contract. We know that something more important than genitality takes over in a relationship between two persons of the same sex if that relationship is to be more than a brief interlude. What takes over is more important than the homogeneity and cannot be denied. To continue to harp on the sex of the object is futile to understanding this more significant relationship. Too many psychiatrists have made and are making their reputations by exploiting the sexual behavior, one fears to the detriment of their patients. If Dr. Hatterer and his American colleagues were less obsessed with sex we could experience a psychotherapeutic Renaissance in this country.

One dispairs of statements such as "reputable psychiatrists... have reported their successful treatments of the treatable homosexual." ("Reputable psychiatrists" at one time treated schizophrenia by pulling all the patient's teeth and administering enemas; later they engaged "reputably" in an orgy of indiscriminate lobotomies, as depicted in *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*.) All homosexuals are, as are all heterosexuals, treatable, if you are willing to accept something other than sexual reorientation as a therapeutic goal. Knowledgeable men in this field, as distinct from reputable, attempt to determine what positive reinforcements and reconstructions the individual is seeking to achieve through his homosexuality and then help him to achieve these in the best way possible.
